

## Lancashire County Council Children & Young People's Public Health Commissioning—Child Health Profiles 2017

Public Health, assisted by Business Intelligence within Lancashire County Council have created 34 middle level (MSOA\* cluster) Child Health Profiles (CHPs). This is because the CHPs on the Public Health England website are only at upper tier level. This does not show the outcome data at sub-district level but just an overview of children and young people's health across the whole of County. These lower level profiles highlight where children's health needs are the greatest and opportunities to reduce inequalities are greatest.

### FLEETWOOD

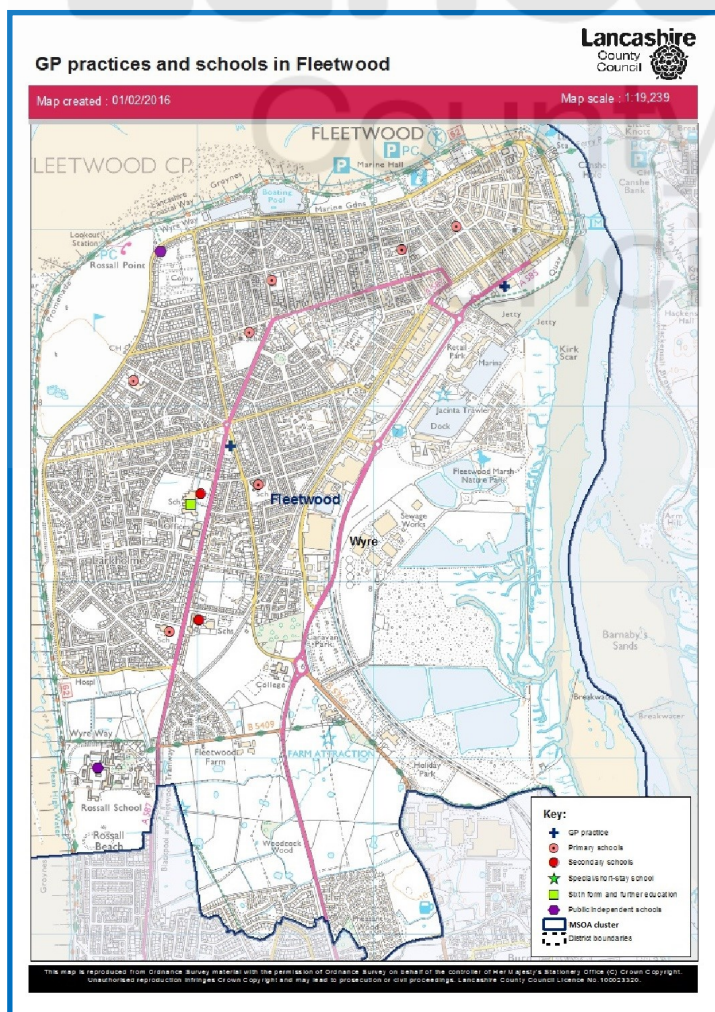
There are 7 primary schools, 2 secondary schools and 3 independent schools in Fleetwood.

There are just 2 GP practices.

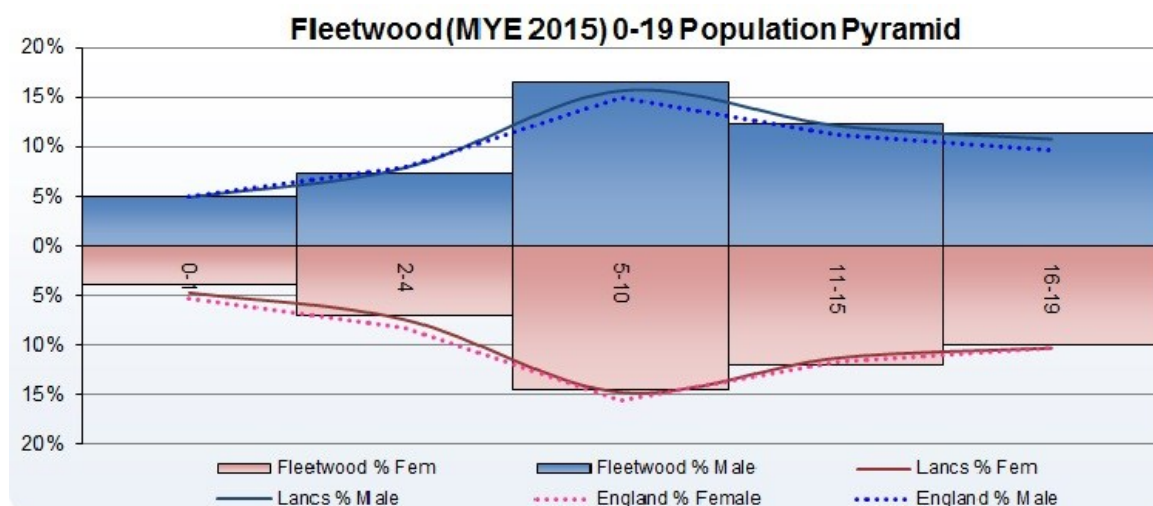
Child health outcomes are generally poor in Fleetwood. It has the highest rate (ranked 1st) of emergency admissions in 0-4 year olds of the 34 CHPs covering Lancashire (where 34 = best). It also has the highest proportion of school children getting free school meals (27%). Educational attainment is low with just 44% of 10/11 year olds passing key stage 2 and 45% of 15/16 year olds passing key stage 4.

Infant deaths are high with a rate of 9 deaths per 1000 live births over a ten year period (29 actual deaths).

The 'best' indicators for Fleetwood are the A&E attendance rate for 5-19 year olds with just 229 attendances per 1000 (32nd), the number of looked after children aged 5-17 (31st) and the rate of children living in Fleetwood killed or seriously injured in a road traffic accident (29th).

\* MSOA - Middle Layer Super Output Areas are built from groups of Lower Layer Super Output Areas. The minimum population is 5000 and the mean is 7200

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Indicators are ranked according to their position within the 34 MSOA clusters and the colour ramp indicates in which quintile the value is located. The top seven being **red** (worst 5th), the next seven being **orange** (2nd worst 5th) the mid 6 being **yellow** (middle 5th) the next to best seven being **blue** (2nd best fifth) and the lowest seven being **green** (best 5th)
