Specialist Level of Support	Disability Access Fund (DAF)
Funding	In response to the Early Years Funding Consultation the Government has announced increased support for children with disabilities through the introduction of a Disability Access Fund (DAF) which will provide £615 per year for every eligible child. The new funding comes into effect from 1 April 2017. Eligibility, payments and claims information can all be found at: https://www3.lancashire.gov.uk/corporate/web/?siteid=2979&pageid=6658&e=e#anchor241762 The funding is available for all three and four year old children who receive Disability Living Allowance (DLA) and are accessing an early education funded childcare place. Four year old children who are in primary reception classes are not eligible for the funding.

The <u>Inclusion Fund</u> provides support to early years settings to address the needs of individual children who have emerging and identified special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and promote inclusion.

All early years providers in Lancashire who are eligible for 3/4 year old funded early education (FEE) can apply for additional funding through the Inclusion Fund.
