
NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(NEWARTH LANE AND SPRINGTIDE CLOSE,
HESKETH BANK, WEST LANCASHIRE BOROUGH)
(JUNCTION TABLE)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce a junction table in the following locations:

- 1. Newarth Lane, Hesketh Bank, from a point 7 metres north east of the intersection of the centreline of Newarth Lane and Springtide Close, for a distance of 16.6 metres in a south westerly direction.
- 2. Springtide Close, Hesketh Bank, from the southern kerbline of Newarth Lane, for a distance of 16.5 metres in a northerly direction.

The junction table will have a maximum height of 75 millimetres.



Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the raised junction table at the junction of Newarth Lane is required to slow traffic and allow safe passage of pedestrians due to the increase in traffic from the new housing development. These proposals are being funded by Section 278 monies deposited by the developer and linked to the adjacent housing development.
