**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose the following:

- 1. Remove a road hump in Harrogate Crescent, Burnley, from a point 84 metres north east of its junction with the centreline of Lytham Road, for a distance of 3.6 metres in an easterly direction.
- 2. Introduce a road hump in Harrogate Crescent, Burnley, from a point 98 metres north east of its junction with the centreline of Lytham Road, for a distance of 3.7 metres in an easterly direction. The road hump will have a maximum height of 75 millimetres.

## **Statement of Reasons**

The requirements of the speed hump relocation are due to the new development commencing in the area, it will also help towards reducing the speed of motorists which will create a safer environment for pedestrians.
