
NOTICE OF PROPOSAL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (WHALLEY CLITHEROE BYPASS, WISWELL, RIBBLE VALLEY BOROUGH) (PUFFIN CROSSING)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a puffin crossing in the following locations:

- a) Whalley Clitheroe Bypass, Wiswell, northbound, from its roundabout junction with Whalley Clitheroe Bypass, for a distance of 43.5 metres in a northerly direction;
- b) Whalley Clitheroe Bypass, Wiswell, southbound, from a point 6.5 meters north if its roundabout junction with Whalley Clitheroe Bypass, for a distance of 61 metres in a northerly direction.



Statement of Reasons

It is proposed to provide a puffin crossing and reduce the existing speed limit to provide safer road crossing facilities for pedestrians between the proposed development on the eastern side of the A59 and the existing business and enterprise park on the western side of the A59 at the Holm Road roundabout location.
