

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(ROADTRAIN AVENUE, RODDLESWORTH WAY,
LEYLAND) (PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a Pegasus crossing in the following locations:

- a) Roadtrain Avenue, Moss Side, Leyland, from a point 56 metres west of its junction with the centreline of Badger Drive for a distance of 43.5 metres in a westerly direction;
- b) Roadtrain Avenue, Moss Side, Leyland, from a point 6 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Lynx Place for a distance of 48.5 metres in a northerly direction;
- c) Roddlesworth Way, Moss Side, Leyland, from a point 50 metres south west of its junction with the centreline of Osprey Place for a distance of 49 metres in a westerly direction.

Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the proposed Pegasus crossings are to provide safe crossing points for cyclists, horse riders and pedestrians to promote sustainable travel and promote social inclusion.
