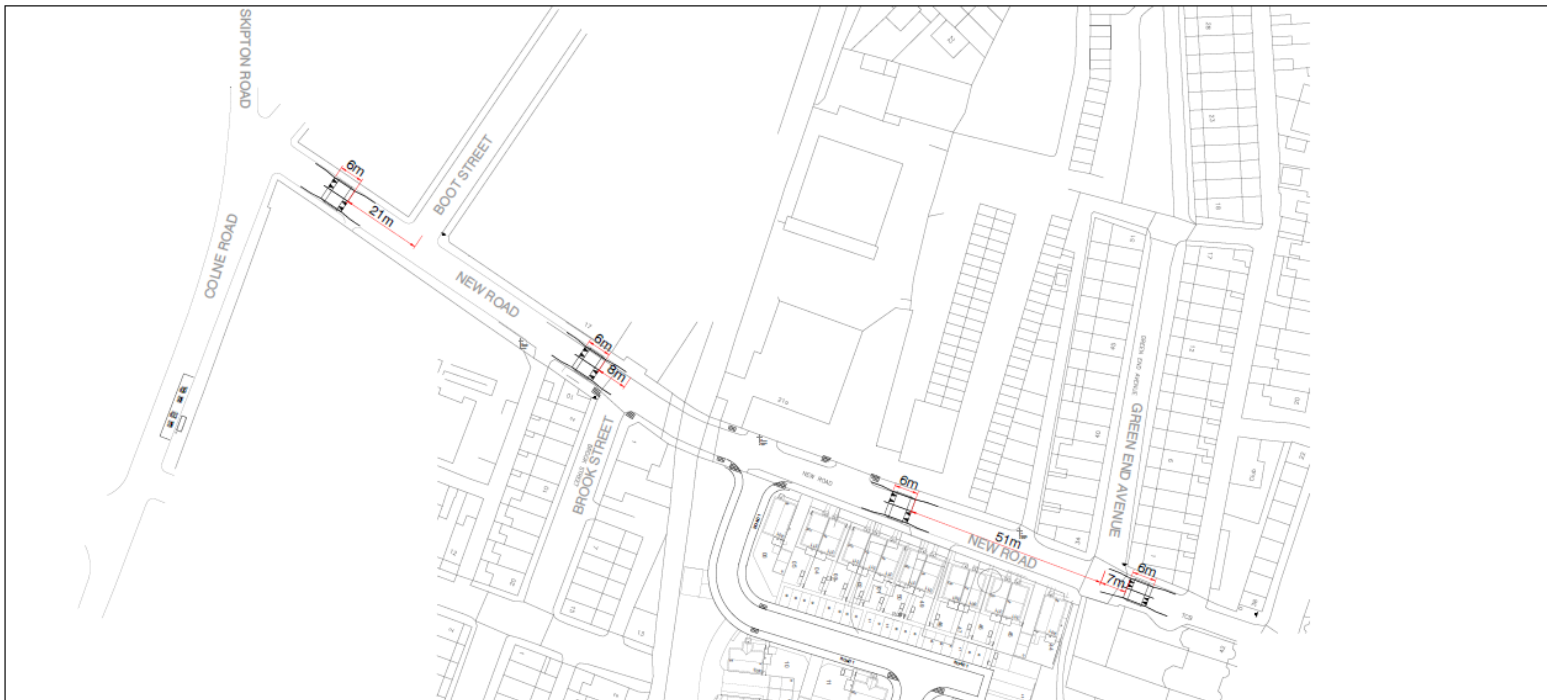


**NOTICE OF PROPOSAL  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980  
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL  
(NEW ROAD, EARBY, PENDLE BOROUGH)  
(ROAD HUMPS)**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce road humps in the following locations:

- New Road, Earby, from a point 21 metres north west of its junction with the centreline of Boot Street for a distance of 6 metres in a north westerly direction;
- New Road, Earby, from a point 8 metres north west of its junction with the centreline of Brook Street for a distance of 6 metres in a north westerly direction;
- New Road, Earby, from a point 51 metres north west of its junction with the centreline of Green End Avenue for a distance of 6 metres in a north westerly direction;
- New Road, Earby, from a point 7 metres south east of its junction with the centreline of Green End Avenue for a distance of 6 metres in a south easterly direction.

### **Statement of Reasons**

The purpose of the road humps along New Road is to slow traffic and allow safe passage of pedestrians due to the increase in traffic from the new housing development. The proposals are being pursued and constructed as part of a s278 Agreement under the Highways Act 1980 by the developer as part of a new development which will introduce further traffic movements.
