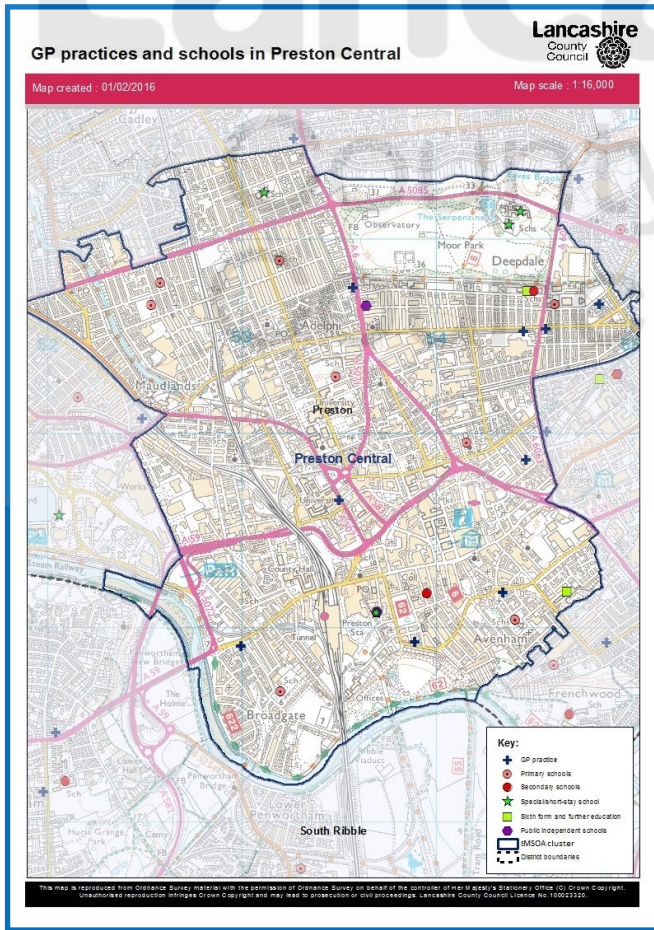


Lancashire County Council Children & Young People’s Public Health Commissioning—Child Health Profiles 2017

Public Health, assisted by Business Intelligence within Lancashire County Council have created 34 middle level (MSOA* cluster) Child Health Profiles (CHPs). This is because the CHPs on the Public Health England website are only at upper tier level. This does not show the outcome data at sub-district level but just an overview of children and young people’s health across the whole of County. These lower level profiles highlight where children’s health needs are the greatest and opportunities to reduce inequalities are greatest.



PRESTON CENTRAL

Preston Central has 7 primary schools, 2 secondary schools (1 with a 6th form) and 2 special schools. There are 2 independent schools, a university and a further education facility.

There are 8 GP practices.

28% of children live in poverty in Preston Central (ranked 3 of the 34 CHPs where 1 = worst) and 20% of school children are on free school meals (5th).

The rate of emergency admissions for 0-4 year olds is ranked 3rd worst with 301 per 1000 0-4 yr olds.

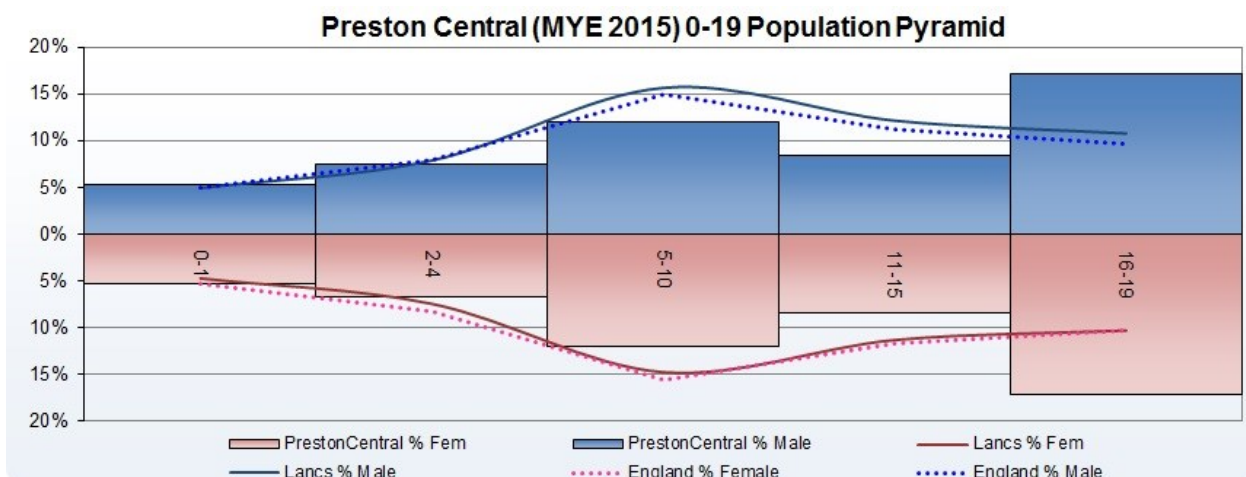
There is a high proportion of live births to mums aged <20 years (ranked 6th) with 6% of all maternities in this area being to young mums.

There is a high proportion of young people living in Preston Central that are not in employment education or training, and the % of children attaining key stage 2 education (age 11) is low (45%).

The ‘best’ indicator is that there are few children carrying excess weight in reception (19% ranked 31) however, although not in this profile, Preston Central has the highest % of underweight children in reception (4%) and Year 6 (5%).

There are proportionally fewer 5-15 year olds yet considerably more 16-19 year olds living in Preston Central.

Indicators are ranked according to their position within the 34 MSOA clusters and the colour ramp indicates in which quintile the value is located. The top seven being red (worst 5th), the next seven being orange (2nd worst 5th) the mid 6 being yellow (middle 5th) the next to best seven being blue (2nd best fifth) and the lowest seven being green (best 5th)
