- c) The gate(s) will be removed by the owner if the reason for the authorisation ceases to be applicable (or secured open if the reason for the authorisation temporarily ceases to be applicable)
- d) No barbed wire or chain/padlock will be attached to any part of the gate(s)
- e) Lancashire County Council retain a right to affix waymark arrows and/or advisory signs to the gate and/or posts
- f) Only one latch, loop or other closing device will be attached to the gate(s) and will be openable from the saddle
- g) The surface of the public right of way through the gate(s) will maintained by the owner such that it is at least as good as the approaches to the gate(s).
- h) The top of the gate(s) will be no more than 1 metre from the ground
- i) The gate will conform to BS5709:2018
- j) Specify further conditions if required, otherwise delete this line
