Definitions

For Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Free Schools and Academies for Admission Purposes

The following terms used throughout this booklet are defined as below, except where individual arrangements spell out a different definition.

Distance

The 'straight line' method of measurement only applies for admission purposes. For transport 'walking routes' are used to determine distance. Explanations of these terms can be found in the main booklet.

Parents/Family Members

A parent is any person who has parental responsibility or care of the child. Where admission arrangements refer to 'parent's attendance at church' it is sufficient for just one parent to attend. 'Family members' include only parents and siblings.

Medical/Social/Welfare

Where schools have a medical/social/welfare admission criterion then this should take into account the circumstances of the child and the family. Please note the Local Authority information in the accompanying admissions booklet.

Looked After Children

The School Admissions Code [December 2014] states that within the oversubscription criteria, the highest priority **must** be given to looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).

A 'looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption(2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4) .

(1) A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school.

(2) This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Childrens Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).

(3) Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.

(4) See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

This includes children who are legally adopted from overseas. Relevant, legal documents must be provided to evidence the adoption.

Admission Authorities for faith schools may give priority to all looked after children and previously looked after children whether or not of the faith, but they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children of the faith before other children of the faith. Where any element of priority is given in relation to children not of the faith they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children not of the faith above other children not of the faith.

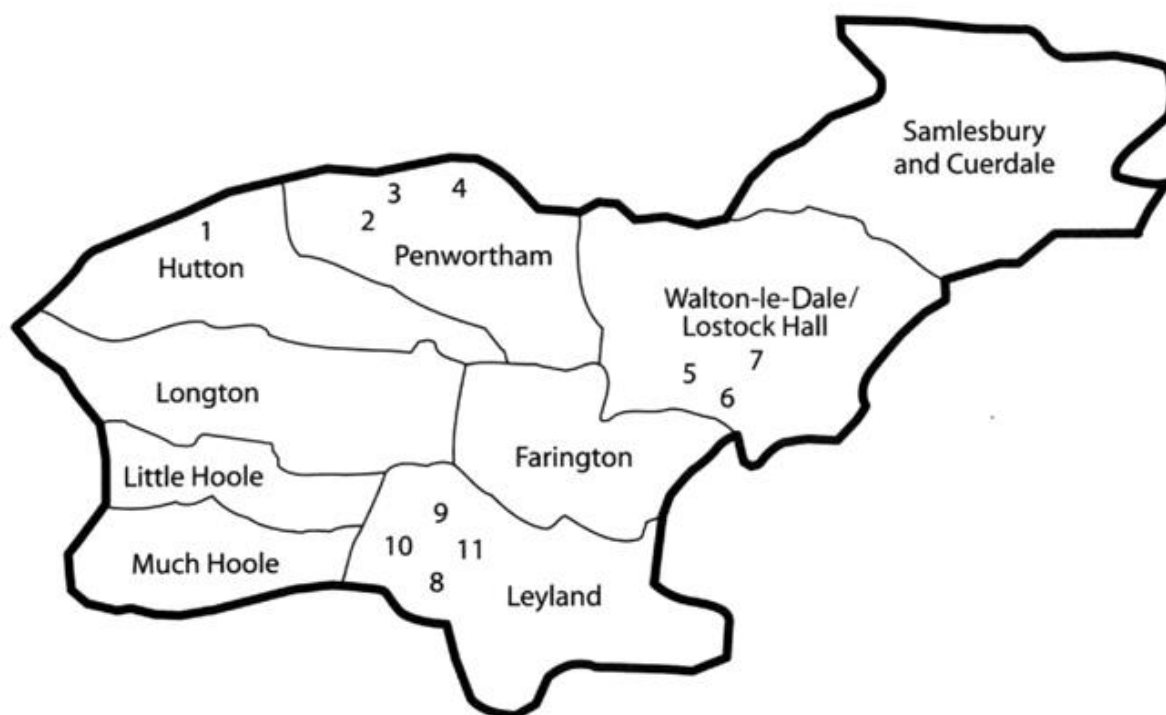

Information about Admission to Secondary Schools in Preston, South Ribble, West Lancashire and Chorley

This information is about secondary schools in Preston, South Ribble, West Lancashire and Chorley. Similar information about other areas is available from Area Education Offices listed on the first page of the booklet "Secondary School Admissions in Lancashire – Information for Parents". It is possible for you to state a preference for schools in different areas. You should, however, only submit one application form.

In this information, you will find brief details about each school including the admission number. This is the number of children who can be offered a place at the school in September 2020. Further information you may need is available if you contact either the school concerned or the Area Education Office.

Information provided about each school

You are given the basic details about each school – name, address, Headteacher's name etc, plus the total number of pupils who attend. You will be particularly interested in the number of places available for September 2020 – **the admission number**.

For Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools, there is additional information given below the main school details. This refers to the intake of pupils in September 2019. On the left-hand side, it states the number of places that were available for that year (i.e. the admission number) and the number of preferences that were received for the school.

For Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Free Schools and Academies similar information is given about the number of preferences expressed. You are also given some details of the admissions policy. This is individual to each school. Details about how the criteria were applied can be requested from the individual school.

For Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Free Schools and Academies please note that this booklet contains summaries of the policies only. You must approach the school for a copy of their full policy if you are thinking of applying.

Please note that for secondary schools in Lancashire's co-ordinated admission scheme, information is given about preferences expressed for 2019. Given the variety of Admission Authorities involved and additional schools outside the co-ordinated system, the figures may need further interpretation for individual schools.

Parents for whom the previous level of application is an important issue are advised to discuss the matter with the Admissions Team at the Area Education Office or with the individual school concerned.

CONFIRMATION OF OFFERS

For September 2020, offers will be confirmed online only for all those who apply on Lancashire's online system (this was around 95% of applicants for the previous year). For those who do not receive a first preference offer, links to reserve list and appeal forms will be available.

Lancashire's online system will go live on morning of 2 March 2020 to allow online applicants to view their school offer.

Letters will be issued by second class post on 2 March 2020 to any applicants who submit a paper form.

Admission Policy & Criteria for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools in Preston, South Ribble, West Lancashire & Chorley Districts

(This can also apply to schools that are in transition to Academy status)

An admission number will be published showing the maximum number of pupils that the school will admit in the Autumn Term 2020. Parents are given the opportunity to express three preferences for a secondary school. Published criteria are used to decide which children should be offered the available places. In secondary schools an equal preference system operates, whereby the three parental preferences are given equal status. Each preference will be considered equally against the admissions criteria.

When a secondary school is oversubscribed the following priorities apply in order:

1. Looked after children and those who have been previously looked after, (see note (x) below), then
2. Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical, social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned. (See note (i) below) then
3. Children living within the school's geographical priority area with older brothers or sisters attending the school when the younger child will start, (see note iii below).
4. Children living within the school's geographical priority area, then
5. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area with older brothers or sisters still attending the school when the younger child will start (See note (iii) below) then
6. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area (see note (iv) below).

Notes

- (i) The medical, social and welfare criterion will consider issues relevant to the child and/or the family. This category may include children without a statement who have special needs.
- (ii) As required by law, all children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs/EHC naming a school will be admitted before the application of the over-subscription criteria. Children who have a statement for special needs have their applications considered separately.
- (iii) Brothers and sisters includes step children, half brothers and sisters, fostered and adopted children living with the same family at the same address (consideration may be given to applying this criterion to full brothers and sisters who reside at different addresses). The priority does not apply to siblings whose brothers and sisters transferred into a sixth form at 16+.
- (iv) The distance criterion which will be used as the tie breaker if there is oversubscription within any of the admission criteria is a straight line (radial) measure. If the Local Authority is unable to distinguish between applicants using the published criteria (eg twins or same block of flats) places will be offered via a random draw.

The distance measure is a straight line (radial) measure centre of building to centre of building.

- (v) A child's permanent address is the one where he/she normally lives and sleeps and goes to school from. Proof of residence may be requested at any time throughout the admission process, (including after a child has accessed a school place).

- (vi) The Local Authority will keep waiting lists for all Lancashire schools until 31 August 2020. These are kept in priority order using the school's published admission criteria. From 1 September 2020 for one school term only waiting lists will be retained by individual admission authorities (the Local authority for community and voluntary controlled schools and individual voluntary aided and trust schools will each retain their own list).
- (vii) Children will not normally be able to start school other than at the beginning of the term unless they have moved into the area or there are exceptional circumstances.
- (viii) Applications for school places which are received late will not necessarily be dealt with at the same time as those received by the set deadline. The reasons for a late application may be requested and where these are not exceptional the relevant admission criteria will be initially applied to all others received on time. The late application will be dealt with after this process.

Application forms received after the published closing date, will only be considered at that time if the following conditions apply:

- (a) if the number of preferences received for the school is below the published admission number or:
- (b) there are extenuating circumstances justifying a late application.

These may include:

- (a) parents moving into the County after the closing date;
- (b) parent/carer illness which required hospitalisation for the major part of the period between the publication of the composite prospectus and the closing date for applications.
- (ix) Where a child lives with one parent for part of the week and another for the rest of the week only one address will be accepted for a school admission application. This will normally be the one where the child wakes up for the majority of school days (Monday to Friday). Proof of residence may be requested at any time throughout the admissions process.
- (x) the highest priority **must** be given to looked after children¹ and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted² (or became subject to a residence order³ or special guardianship order⁴). Further references to previously looked after children in the Code means children who were adopted (or subject to residence orders or special guardianship orders) immediately following having been looked after. This includes children who are legally adopted from overseas. Relevant legal documents must be provided to evidence the adoption.

The Authority has a duty to co-ordinate admission arrangements for all Lancashire maintained schools.

The Authority will ensure that all Lancashire parents whose children are transferring to reception or Year 7 classes, receive the offer of one secondary or primary school place on the agreed date.

¹ A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

² Under the terms of the Adoption and Children Act 2002. See section 46 (adoption orders).

³ Under the terms of the Children Act 1989. See section 8 which defines a 'residence order' as an order settling the arrangements to be made as to the person with whom the child is to live.

⁴ See section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

SUMMARY OF POLICY ▼

In the event that there are more applicants than places, after admitting all children with a statement of educational need naming the school, the governing body will allocate places using the criteria below, which are listed in order of priority.

1. Looked after children and previously looked after children.
2. Children with special medical or social circumstances affecting the child **where these needs can only be met at this school.**
3. Children of staff who have been employed by Archbishop Temple School for two years prior to the closing date for applications. This applies to all staff, full and part time, who are employed by the school.
4. A maximum of 105 children in the following priority order:
 - a. Children who have a parent/carer who has attended public worship in a Christian church weekly/fortnightly for the year leading up to the 1st September 2019.
 - b. Children who have a parent/carer who has attended public worship in a Christian church monthly for the year leading up to the 1st September 2019..
 - c. Children who have a parent/carer who has attended public worship in a Christian church monthly for six months leading up to the 1st September 2019.
5. A maximum of 40 children who attend our partner primary schools of Grimsargh St. Michael's C of E Primary School, Broughton-in-Amounderness Church of England Primary School, Fulwood St Peters CE Primary School or St Andrew's CE Primary School, Ashton. Where there are more applicants than the available places within this category, then the distance between the Ordnance Survey address points for the school and the home measured in a straight line will be used as the final determining factor, nearer addresses having priority over more distant ones. (A maximum of 10 children from each school))
6. A maximum of 10 children who have, or who have a parent/carer who has, attended public worship in a non-Christian faith in membership of the UK Interfaith Network. Applicants in this category will be ranked by distance from the school and then by the following faith groups: Muslims, Hindus, Sikhs, and "Other non-Christian faiths". Places will be allocated successively to a Muslim, a Hindu, a Sikh, a member of another non-Christian Faith, in successive rounds until all the available places in this category are allocated.

For applicants in categories 4 and 6 the governors will request confirmation of attendance from a relevant member of the clergy or church officer or worship leader.

7. Remaining places shall be allocated to other children whose parents/carers wish them to attend the school with the determining factor being distance from school, nearer addresses having priority over more distant ones.

Where there are more applicants than the available places within any of the categories, then the distance between the Ordnance Survey address points for the school and the home measured in a straight line will be used as the final determining factor, nearer addresses having priority over more distant ones. This address point is within the body of the property and usually located at its centre. Where the cut off point is for addresses within the same building, then the single measure between address points will apply and the Local Authority's system of a random draw will determine which address(es) receive the offer(s).

Note

For the avoidance of doubt, matters which the Governors do not take into account in the allocation of places include the following:

- a) Attendance at church as part of normal school activity.
- b) Whether a child is confirmed or being prepared for confirmation.
- c) Whether a child is baptised.
- d) Academic abilities.
- e) Presence of a sibling in the school.

The **major world faiths** are those in membership of the UK Interfaith Network; they include Buddhists, Baha'is, Hindus, Jains, Jews, Muslims, Sikhs, and Zoroastrians.

The faith groups listed in category 6 reflect their representation in Preston City as determined by the 2011 Census. The intention of the governors is to achieve diversity, not proportionality.

Applicants living nearest to the school. The distance measure is a straight line (radial) measure from the centre of the building that is the applicant's home address to the centre of school building. Distances are measured using the Council's Geographic Information System.

If the Governing Body is unable to distinguish between applicants in any of the oversubscription criteria using this distance tie breaker (e.g. applicants in the same block of flats) places will be offered via a random draw.

SUMMARY OF POLICY ▼

1. Looked After Children and previously Looked After Children who are baptised according to the rites of the Roman Catholic Church.
2. Baptised Catholic children living in an associated Parish and attending an associated Catholic primary school.
3. Baptised Catholic children who live in an associated parish and attend a Catholic primary school other than those associated with the school.
4. Baptised Catholic children who attend an associated primary school but do not live in an associated parish.
5. Baptised Catholic children living in an associated parish.
6. Baptised Catholic children who will have a sibling in the school at the time of admission.
7. Baptised Catholic children who attend other Catholic primary schools
8. Other Baptised Catholic children.

In the event of applications exceeding the number of places in any of the above categories, the following tie-breaker will apply :

If there are more children in any of the individual categories than there are places remaining, then those pupils who live nearest to the school by a straight line (radial) measure, will have priority. The distance is measured using a geographical information system and the measurement is taken from the centre point of the property to the centre point of the school.

In the event of a tied distance measurement between address points the Local Authority's system of a random draw will determine which address(es) receive the offer(s).

If the acceptance of all the children in a given criterion were to take the number of places offered to above the admission number, then places will be offered first to those pupils living nearest to the school by a straight line (radial) measure. The distance will be measured using the Lancashire County Council's geographical information system, the measurement being taken from the central point of the property to the central point of the school until the admission number is reached. In the event of a tied distance measurement between address points the Local Authority's system of a random draw will determine which address(es) receive the offer(s).

For Lancashire families, schools outside of their GPA (Geographical Priority Area) and those in other Local Authorities and districts will be considered when assessing eligibility for assistance for transport to school.

For those pupils attending faith schools, the Council previously granted partial assistance with travel costs if the pupil attended the nearest school of their faith. From September 2018 transport assistance will **only be** available if a pupil attends their nearest school or academy and meets the distance criteria. Please note; if parents decide to send their child to a school that is not their nearest suitable school, then they will be responsible for the cost of transporting their child to that school/academy.

The basis for payment of travelling expenses

From September 2018, the County Council removed the discretionary element of the Home to School Transport policy and so there is no longer any denominational transport assistance available for new pupils starting at either primary or secondary schools in September 2020, unless the family meet the low income criteria (see below).

(Transport Assistance will still be provided for existing pupils as it has been agreed that the changes in policy are phased-in so that children who started school under one set of transport arrangements continue to benefit from them until they either conclude their education at the school, choose to move to another school or move home address.)

National Extended Rights Policy (Low Income)

If your child does not qualify for transport under the general policy (above), a national policy provides extended rights to children who are eligible for free school meals or whose parents receive the maximum level of Working Tax Credit (WTC) i.e. reduction to the income must be £0.00 on your award notice. This policy provides transport for:

Primary Children – age 8 but under 11 years, transport will be provided to the nearest suitable school where that school is more than 2 miles from the child's home.

Secondary Children – transport to one of the 3 nearest suitable qualifying schools where the school is more than 2 but less than 6 miles from the child's home OR transport to the nearest suitable secondary school preferred because of your religion or belief for children whose parents adhere to that particular faith, if the school is between 2 and 15 miles from home.

Concessionary Travel

If your child is not eligible for free travel you may be able to purchase a season ticket if there are spare places on a school transport service. Please contact the School Traveline for advice on 0300 123 6738.

In some cases it may be more cost effective for your child to travel on a public bus service and purchase a discounted period travel ticket direct from the bus operator.

Monday 2 September 2019	Apply from this date at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools (Please remember to press the 'submit' button every time you leave the online system)
Thursday 31 October 2019	National closing date for secondary applications (statutory).
During this period all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the published admissions policy. Where there are more applications than places available, decisions are made as to which children should be offered the available places. We will liaise and exchange information with all other admission authorities including neighbouring local authorities. The allocation and offer of a secondary school place is finalised.	
Monday 2 March 2020	Offers issued to parents*
Friday 6 March 2020	Deadline for requesting: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an appeal • a place on the reserve (waiting) list(s)
Week commencing 9 March 2020	Distribute appeal forms to parents
Friday 27 March 2020	Appeal deadline** 1 st round of hearings.

* If you are not happy with an initial offer the appeals period starts from your receipt of the offer. Appeal information will be issued later as this allows some time for reserve lists to operate.

**Appeals which we receive after the deadline will be slotted into the schedule where possible. We cannot guarantee this however, and late appeals may have to be heard after the agreed date at a second round of hearings. The schedule is subject to change depending upon the availability of appeal panel members, clerks, venue, etc.

The closing date for applications is Thursday 31 October 2019.

Does your child qualify for Free School Meals?

Are you claiming the free school meals to which you may be entitled?

School meals are nutritious and you could save at least £380 per year.

Your child's school will also receive over £1000 from the Government for every pupil in the school who is eligible for free school meals. This funding is called 'pupil premium' and can be used by the school to improve pupils' attainment.

Please register your eligibility - even if you don't want to take up the free meals - so that the school can access this extra funding.

To be eligible you must be receiving one of the benefits listed below:

- Universal Credit with a household income of less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income-Based Jobseekers' Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, not entitled to Working Tax Credit and household income less than £16,190
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Income Support
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' – the payment you receive for a further four weeks after you finish work

If you are receiving one of the above benefits, please ring the Area Education Office on 01772 531809. They can do an immediate online check for you.

We only require your name, date of birth and national insurance number to do this.

Please note, you still need to register your child with us even if you have an older child already attending school and receiving free school meals.
