## **COVID-19 Testing (lan Crabtree)**

- Request from Chief Nursing officer in England to provide Infection Prevention and control training for care homes as a matter of urgency
- NHS will be contacting you to participate in this virtual training very soon
- Training will also include how to swab residents for a covid test
- Must use principles of MCA
- If Care Homes unable to offer swabbing, then we will support either by NHS swabbers or volunteer swabbers
- If Volunteer swabbers, we would ask due diligence is followed and residents are supported by someone they know

# **Swabbing Training**

- Carers and nurses who will be swabbing residents in care homes should complete the online care home swabbing competency assessment before carrying out swabbing.

## **PPE - Train the Trainer**

- IPC Team and health colleagues across the CCG's will be offering training to care homes re correct use of PPE.

## **PHE - Care Home Calls**

- A national team on behalf of PHE is contacting care homes to follow up where the home has notified an outbreak.
- The Minister of State for Care wants a daily update on care home status, focussing on whether a care home is 'recovered' from a previously notified outbreak of COVID-19 (based on 28 days since onset of symptoms in the most recent case).
- To meet this requirement, a short-term programme to follow-up care homes to ascertain 'recovery' status has been established based on actively contacting homes that have notified HPTs of outbreaks more than 28 days ago. The team started calling NW care homes on 14<sup>th</sup> May.
- This is understood to be a short term measure with another reporting mechanism being developed.

## Local Resilience Forum: Development of Social Care Cell

- <u>Leadership</u>: by Louise Taylor, Operating across the Lancashire footprint including BwD and Blackpool and including NHS
- <u>Objective</u>: Protect Life and Support Resilience of the care sector: safe staffing, safe care, safe working practices and a financially viable and sustainable care market
- <u>Infection prevention control</u>: effective arrangements including deep clean and consistent and appropriate use of PPE
- <u>PPE:</u> reliable comprehensive supply
- <u>Testing</u>: regular and effective arrangements which is place based
- <u>Auxiliary workforce</u>: capacity to support and at pace but no rotation



# Local Resilience Forum: Development of Social Care Cell

- <u>Data intelligence</u>: trackers to inform hot spots and mobilisation of support in all its guises
- <u>Support</u>: virtual contact from wide array of disciplines to limit foot fall but provide advise/support/guidance and professional intervention (e.g. GP)
- <u>Modelling</u>: understanding how to 'protect' homes where outbreak to 'maintaining' care in those that do by creating additional convalescence support
- <u>Communications</u>: making sense of all this for the benefits of providers



# COVID -19 Care Home Support Package

- Adult Social Care Infection Control fund not yet sure of allocation but to pay for additional staff or maintain wages
- PPE continue to daw on LRF if urgent shortages; distribution portal rolling out to support normal supply chain
- Quarantining- all patients to be tested on discharge and local authorities to find alternative accommodation as required to help isolate residents
- Clinical support stepping up to support, including remote monitoring
- Comprehensive testing for all residents and staff
- Care Home Support Plan to be produced and published by council by 29/5 and include engagement

# LCC Auxiliary Staffing

- A further communication will be going out to providers, pushing for more shadowing placements.
- Some individuals have been 'handed back' when they have returned to a full rota and before they have completed their shadowing programme.
- Shadowing placements need to last until you're confident that the individual is appropriate for a role within a home's rota.
- They are meant to be there in addition to the rota and being overseen by an experienced member of staff as opposed to being part of the rota.
- The aim of shadowing placements is to get individuals to a point where they can be part of a rota in a home that requires additional support.
- Ongoing work to process individuals through shadowing placements in order to build up that pool of people who can be called upon when there is a need.

Shortage of PPE – Pathway for Providers

### PLEASE NOTE YOU SHOULD BE FORECASTING YOUR PPE NEED 7 DAYS IN ADVANCE

SHORTAGE OF PPE IDENTIFIED

Provider utilises their usual/alternative PPE supplier. This must include exhausting mutual assistance across other care homes in your group, mutual assistance from other homes in your area and new supply routes investigated.

## **PPE Product Recall**

- A letter has been sent to all providers re: Tiger Eye Protectors; this product should not be used in a Covid-19 setting.
- It may be the case that you were supplied this products as part of the PPE distribution organised by the Council between the 10<sup>th</sup> April and 30<sup>th</sup> April 2020.
- If you are in need of visors to use in place of this product or need to request any other items of PPE from the Council, after being unable to source PPE from your usual supply chains, please ensure that you flag this through your interactions with the Oracle Tracker or are raising immediate requirements through the PPE helpline: 0300 123 6786.









## Public Health Updates (Lee Harrington) • Decreased levels of domestic abuse are being reported

- Decreased levels of domestic abuse are being reported during the Covid 19 emergency.
- Business as usual for DA services they are still taking referrals and available for support
- Information on how to access support for victims, friends and family is available and has been uploaded to the portal, and what to do in an emergency. This will include information on perpetrator programmes.



- Inspire Substance Misuse Service is continuing to take referrals for people with alcohol and substance misuse treatment needs
- Reduced the number of detoxifications taking place following government advice to reduce possible hospital admissions
- Needle exchange is available through 'click and collect' and via delivery
- Joint working with health colleagues on the clinical van particularly around the Hotels/Hostel provision e.g. District Nurses. MDTs are working well in the ICPs for these vulnerable cohorts. Out of hours support available from Consultants /Nursing & Operations for moving between Covid Protect to Covid Care.



### **Sexual health services – Blackpool Teaching Hospitals** Postal testing (T<sub>4</sub>) available for Lancashire residents via website this week – hard launch via social media targeted for bank holiday weekend. This will be for both symptomatic testing and asymptomatic. The service is working towards a quality improvement plan.
