## Job Description -

## **Principal Flood Risk Officer**

The post holder will have line management responsibility for a team of flood risk professionals carrying out works on diverse flood risk, flood alleviation, drainage strategy and drainage infrastructure projects to support the delivery of the council's Flood Risk Management Strategy action plan

## Accountabilities/Responsibilities:

Responsible for service planning to develop and progress technical drainage and flood mitigation solutions

Develop and maintain effective processes for flood reporting, recording and investigation.

Design, plan and manage relevant surveys, assessments and audits e.g. undertake flood investigations, identifying causes of flooding.

Technical lead for flood risk projects in areas such as: business case reporting; surface water management; flood risk management strategies and assessments; development of resilience and resistance measures for flood risk; issuing Watercourse and Land drainage consents

The provision of high quality planning advice for major infrastructure projects; planning applications ensuring compliance with surface water flood risk and drainage requirements

Advise on having suitable internal structures for flood risk management in the event of an emergency, including liaison with the Council's civil contingencies officer and external groups/organisations.

Reviewing and advising on Sustainable Drainage matters as part of the Development Management process

Submit funding bids to external bodies for flood risk infrastructure projects

Working collaboratively with key stakeholders including the Environment Agency, IDB, water companies, neighbouring LLFA's, other flood risk authorities.

Brief elected members, management and members of the public on flooding strategies and respond to complaints as required
