How is coronavirus affecting people in Lancashire?

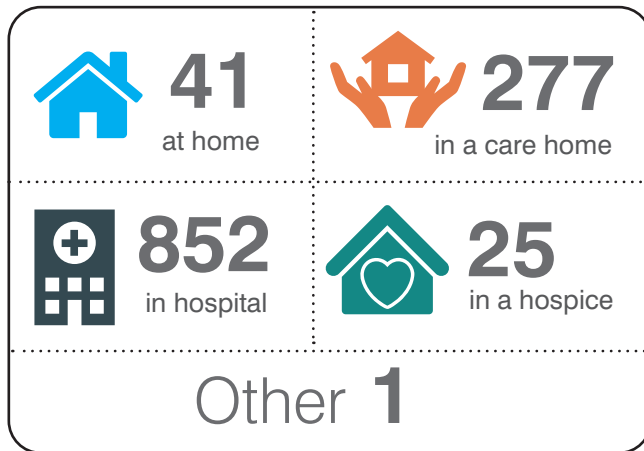

It also shows how Lancashire compares to other areas of the country.

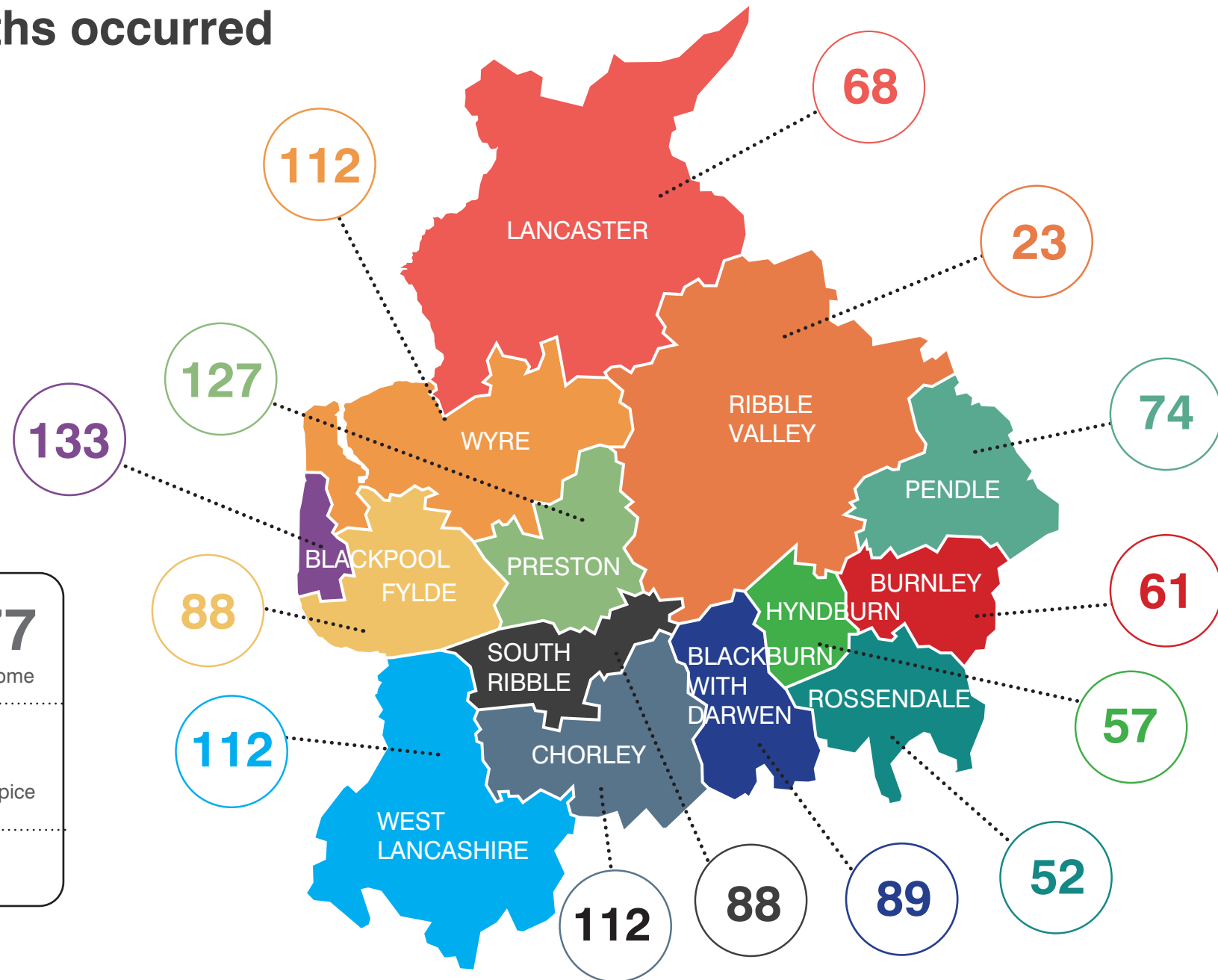


COVID-related deaths occurred up to 19 June

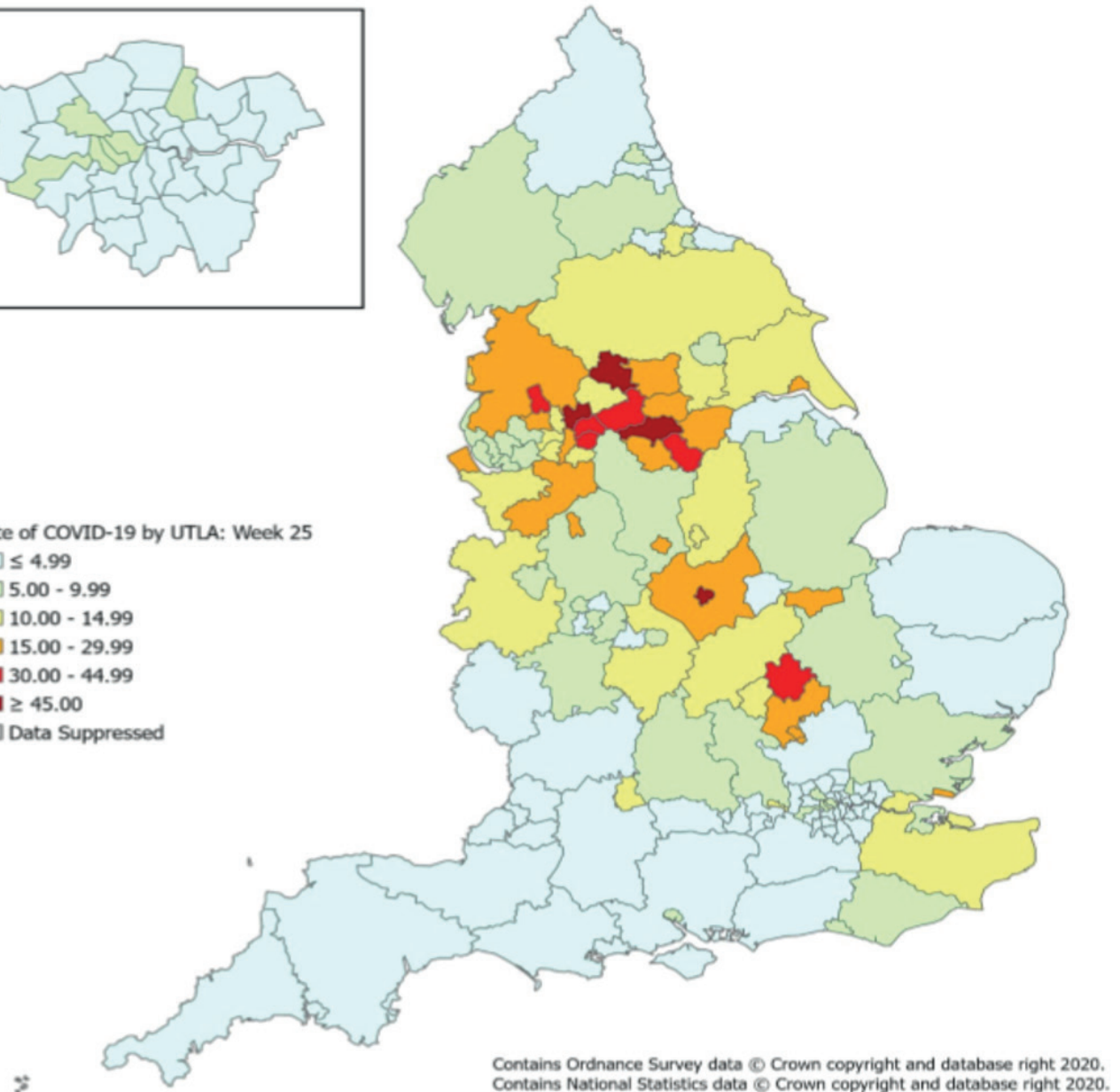
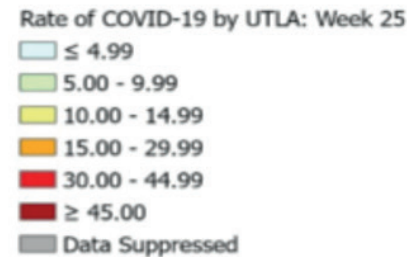

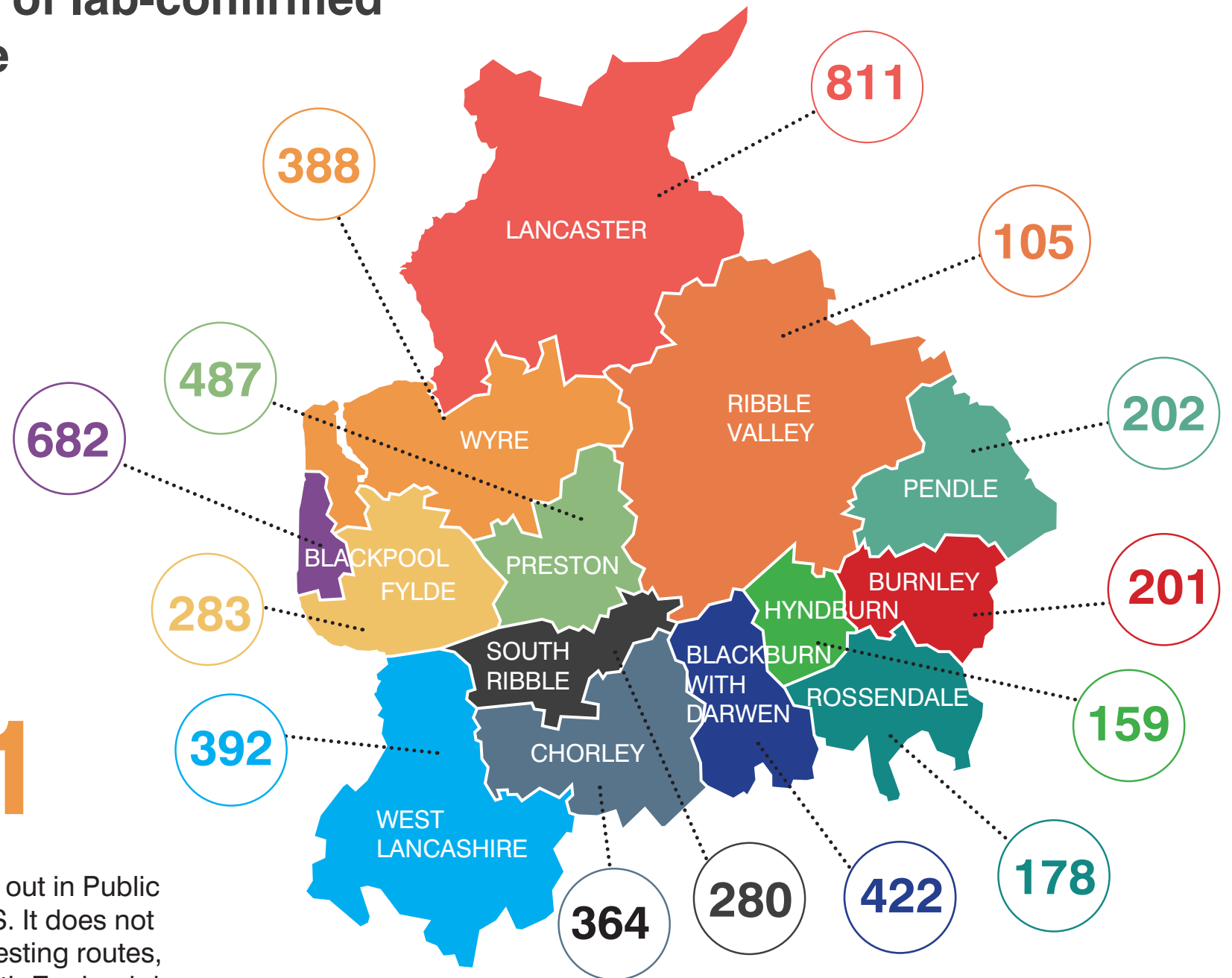

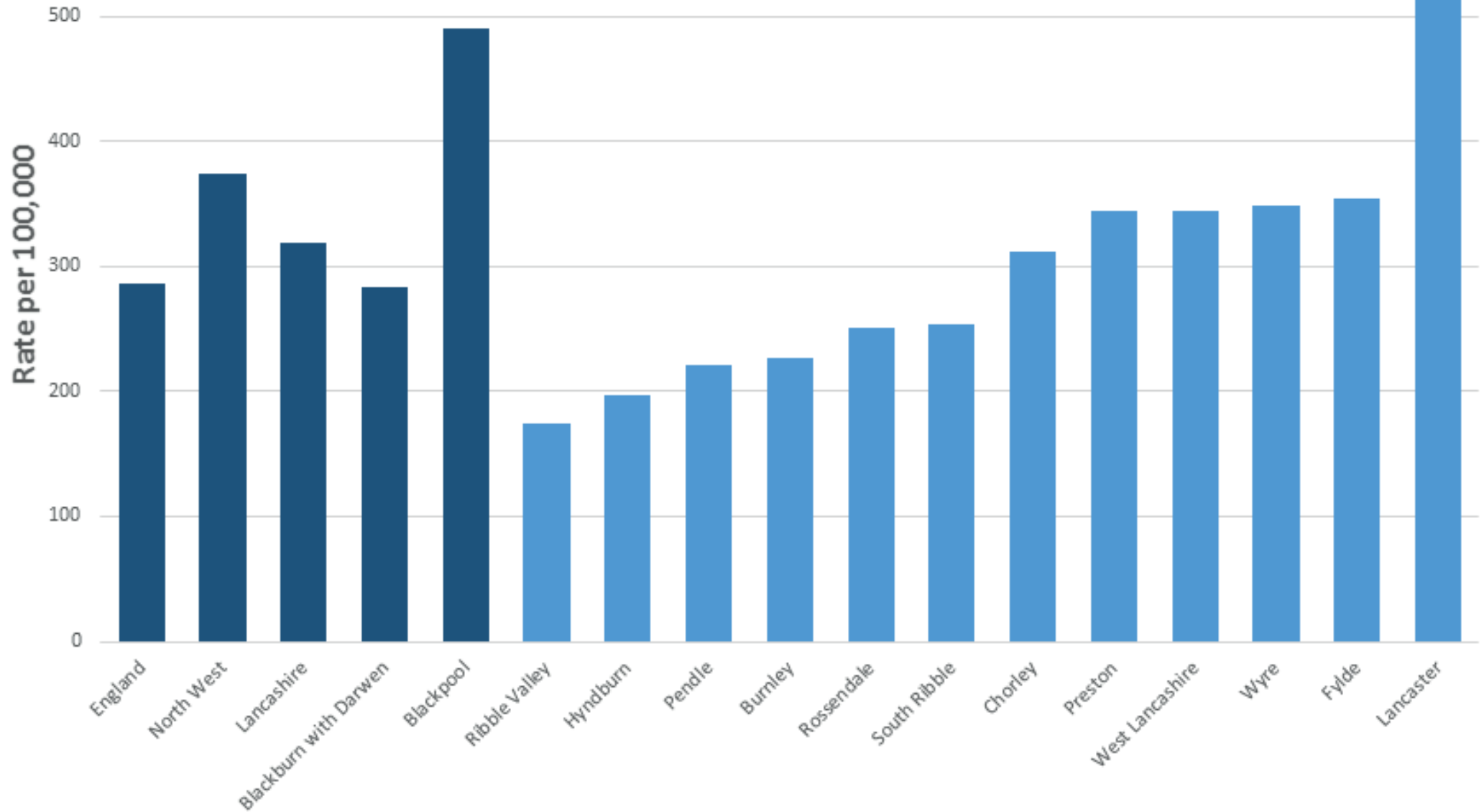

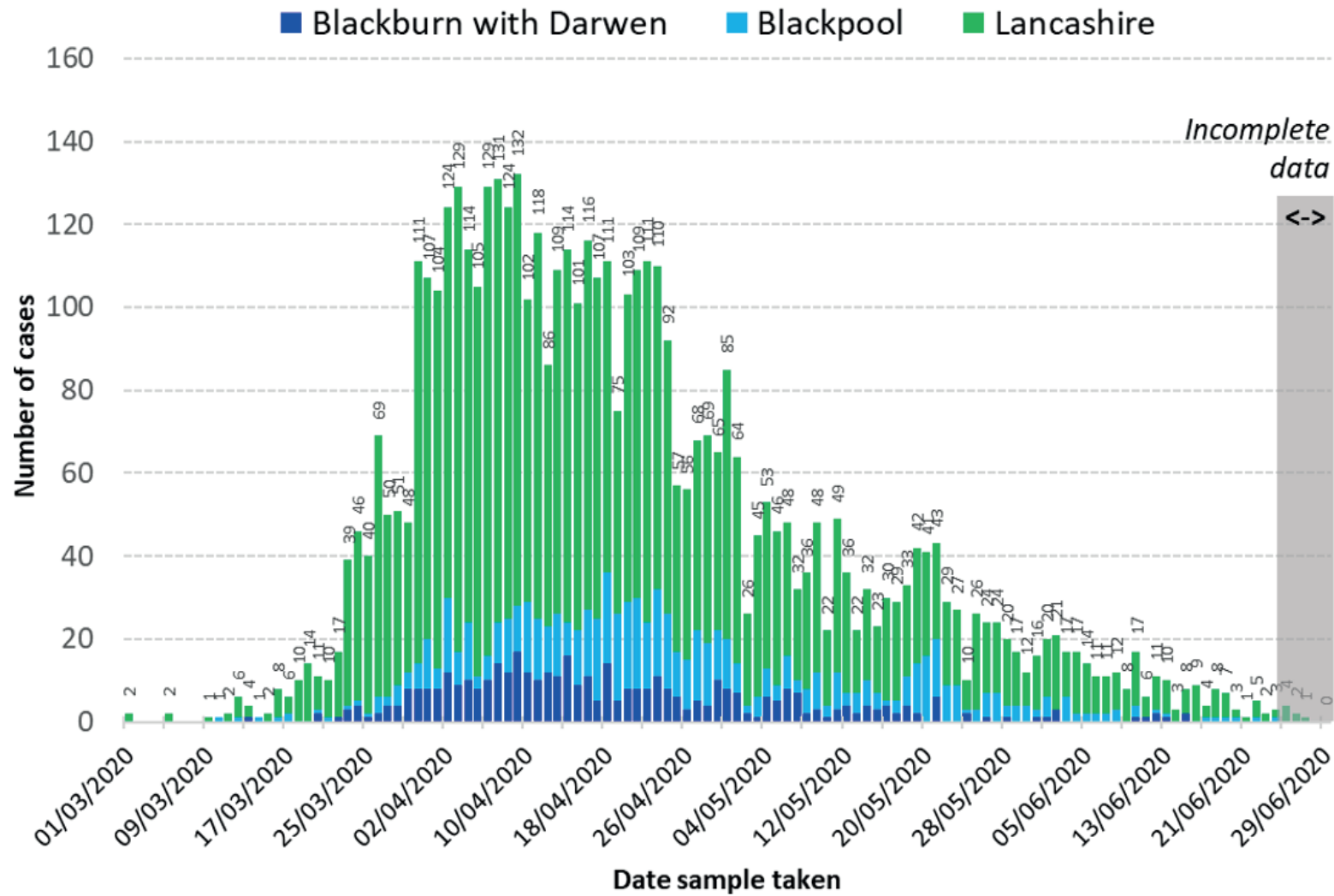

Cumulative lab-confirmed cases up to 29 June, rate per 100,000



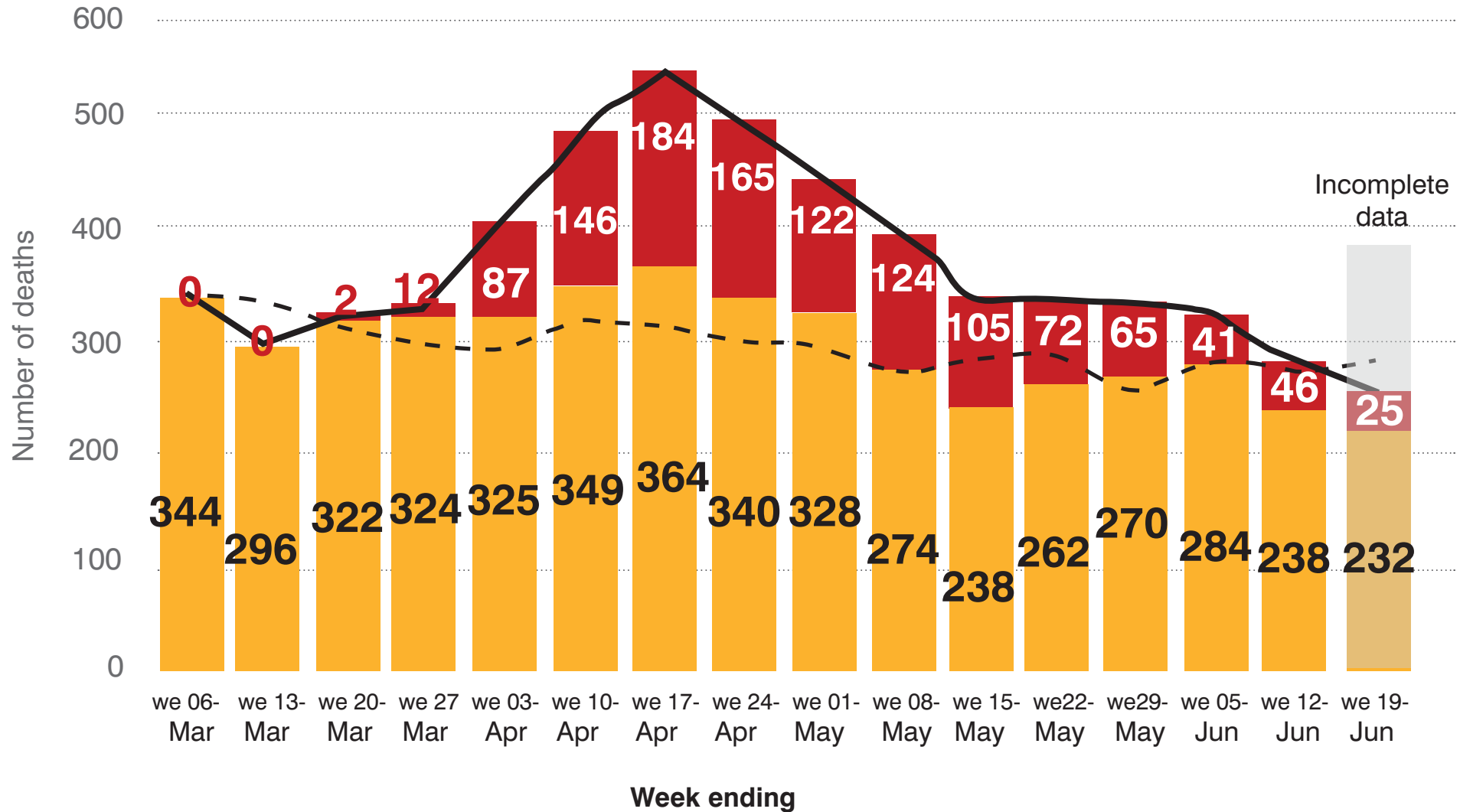
Daily lab-confirmed cases to 29 June
