
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Foster Carer Learning and Development Programme





We will provide you with access to a wide range of learning, development and training opportunities to support you in your role as a foster carer. This training will include helping you to understand and respond to the needs of the children that you are caring for.

You will benefit from a thorough induction programme. This induction will start at the beginning of your assessment process and will continue during your first year of being a foster carer. We will do all we can to make sure that you have the knowledge and skills that you need.

We really pleased to let you know about the Foster Care Academy we run at Lancashire County Council.

Becoming a foster carer is exciting, but we appreciate that it can also be challenging at times.

Whilst you are being assessed for fostering, you will realise there is a lot to learn and understand to help you to do the best you can for our children in care. We have created a range of different support and learning opportunities to give you the skills, knowledge and confidence you need to understand your role as a foster carer and also to look after yourself.

Our Foster Care Academy has been developed specifically to focus on support for you throughout assessment and during your first year as a foster carer.

We recognise we need to provide support and guidance all the way and I want to reassure you that we will walk this journey with you.

Training for foster carers

There are some essential courses that we need you to attend within your first year as a foster carer, so that we can make sure you have the information that you need.

During your assessment

Skills to foster

This is a two and a half day preparation course to give you an overview of the various aspects of the role of a foster carer and to provide you with an insight into the experiences of the children in our care. It also provides an introduction to caring for our children and the different professionals you will meet when you are caring for our children.

Essential courses you need to complete within a year of approval

Child development attachment and promoting resilience

This course deals with the stages of child development and shows how children in our care may have been adversely affected by their early childhood experiences. The course also explores how you can contribute towards improving the child and young person's self-esteem and resilience.

First aid for foster carers

This course demonstrates how to provide immediate first aid assistance in a variety of circumstances, mainly involving children.

You will be awarded a certificate when you have completed the course, which will be valid for three years.



Keeping children safe online

The course highlights the potential risks facing children within the online world and their use of technology. This is an essential online, safeguarding session for parents, carers and guardians and is compulsory.

Level 1 Introduction to safeguarding and child protection

This course gives you a comprehensive insight into the often complex and emotive issues of safeguarding and child protection.



E-Learning Prevent duty e-Learning via the Home Office

This offers an introduction to the Prevent duty, and explains how it aims to safeguard vulnerable people from being radicalised to supporting terrorism or becoming terrorists themselves.

Child sexual exploitation e-learning via the Children's Trust

This offers an introduction to child sexual exploitation and the signs to look out for if you suspect that a child is being sexually exploited.

Information governance eLearning

This information governance course makes sure that all people working with sensitive and personal data are aware of their legal responsibilities to keep that information safe and secure, and to know how, when and to whom information can be given or withheld.

We will support you to develop the necessary knowledge, skills and values in order to provide a safe, caring and nurturing environment for the children who are placed in your care.

You will need to complete the Training, Support and Development (TSD) Standards within 12 months of being approved, in preparation for your first review. Recognising and respecting differences

This is an essential course, that we will also ask you to complete within the first two years of your approval. It is designed to assist you to:

- fully appreciate the varied background of children and young people
- respect and promote each child and young person's unique personality, social circumstances and cultural backgrounds.

Effective communication and keeping written records

This course is intended to assist you to effectively communicate with children and young people. It will also help you to keep useful, personal and accurate records on children in our care, which is important for many different reasons.

Supporting you to meet the needs of the children in your care

You may be aware that Lancashire County Council benefits from a specialist emotional wellbeing service called SCAYT+. This is a multi-disciplinary team who support carers, parents and professionals of looked after and adopted children in Lancashire. The team provide advice about creating nurturing environments and parenting children who have experienced loss, trauma, abuse and neglect. SCAYT+ works on the basis of strengthening the relationship between the parent/carer and the child/young person. SCAYT+ support is tailored to meet the individual needs of the child and their family. We offer individual advice and support, training and group based intervention.

SCAYT+ offers you two one-day training courses.

SCAYT+ day 1 explores perspectives on attachment, brain development and trauma. The course develops your skills in providing therapeutic parenting; having an attitude of playfulness, acceptance, curiosity and empathy (PACE), co-regulating a distressed child and providing a nurturing environment.

Once you have completed SCAYT+ day 1, you can develop your skills further on SCAYT+ day 2. The course gives you the opportunity to practise and enhance your therapeutic care skills; putting PACE theory into practice. You are also encouraged to develop strategies to promote your own emotional wellbeing and to explore the importance of self-care and building resilience.

When and where you can attend your training courses

Our training is run at family friendly times during school hours, in the evenings and it is also available online.

We provide a range of venues across Lancashire so that you can attend a course as close to where you live as possible. You are welcome to attend a course at any of the training venues, even if it is further away from where you live, if you prefer to.

We will create a Personal Development Plan (PDP) with you during your assessment and each year after you are approved as a foster carer. Your PDP will include the training, learning, development and support groups that we feel are essential at each stage of your fostering journey and we will also tailor it to your individual learning needs.
