1. Overview

In celebration of Her Majesty's Golden Jubilee in 2002, the Queen's Awards for Voluntary Service was established as part of the UK National Honours system. It is the highest honour that can be bestowed upon voluntary groups, and is equivalent in status to the MBE. As such, the Queen's Awards not only serve to provide recognition of volunteer groups, but also demonstrate the high respect in which volunteering is held. The winners are announced each year on 2 June (the anniversary of The Queen's Coronation).

This prestigious honour recognises the exceptional contributions made to local communities by groups voluntarily devoting their time for the benefit of others. Groups can be nominated by friends, family or members of the public (self-nomination is not permitted), and details of how to make a nomination can be found on the <u>Queen's Awards for Voluntary Service website</u>.

A group of two or more people can be nominated if it is based in the UK, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man. The group has to have been volunteering for the benefit of people in the UK or overseas for at least three years, plus more than half its members must be volunteers who have the right of residence in the UK.

This short article highlights the organisations in the Lancashire-14 area that have received this award. A full list of the Lancashire-14 recipients is provided in table 1. The details of the names of the organisations, dates of awards and locations by local authority boundary from 2003 to 2013, were kindly provided by the office of the Lord-Lieutenant of Lancashire. More recent results have been sourced from the London Gazette. Another useful website is Gov.uk.

2. Award winners in the Lancashire-14 area

2.1 Award winners in the Lancashire-14 area, 2020

In 2020, there were eight winners of the Queen's Awards for Voluntary Service in the Lancashire-14 area:

- Affordable Counselling and Caring Emotional Support Services. Providing the community with access to affordable and accessible counselling and emotional support.
- **Belvedere and Caldervale Sports Club**. Providing football, rugby and cricket facilities for communities in the boroughs of Burnley & Pendle
- **Blackpool Heritage Tram Tours**. Enriching Blackpool's heritage and fulfilling the purposes of wellbeing, learning and education.
- **Fulledge Colts**. Providing inclusive football and community spirit to all, The Pride of Burnley since 1995.

- Halton Community Association. Creating an exceptional centre in Halton and providing community services for residents of all ages.
- **Maundy Relief.** Providing an immediate and sustained response to poverty and need in Hyndburn and East Lancashire.
- **Parbold Douglas Music Society.** Bringing communities together for a life more abundant through live international concert seasons.
- **Parbold Picture House**. Creating and operating regular cinema to bring rural communities together for a life more abundant.

2.2 Award winners in the Lancashire-14 area, 2003 to 2020

The following table lists the 70 voluntary organisations in the Lancashire-14 area that have won this prestigious award between 2003 and 2020. The list emphasises the wide variety of groups that specialise in care/health services, rescue work, activities and support for children and young people, plus environmental projects etc. A few of the organisations cover areas that extend outside the county boundary, but all have been identified as award winners from Lancashire.

3. Description of the geographies used in this report.

The Lancashire-12 area is comprised of the 12 local authorities that fall within the Lancashire County Council administrative boundary. The Lancashire-14 area incorporates the two additional unitary authorities of <u>Blackburn with Darwen</u> and <u>Blackpool</u> and has the same geographic footprint as the <u>Lancashire Local Enterprise Partnership</u> (LEP) area.

The 12 local authorities within the LCC boundary are <u>Burnley Borough Council</u>, <u>Chorley Borough Council</u>, <u>Fylde Borough Council</u>, <u>Hyndburn Borough Council</u>, <u>Lancaster City Council</u>, <u>Pendle Borough Council</u>, <u>Preston City Council</u>, <u>Ribble Valley Borough Council</u>, <u>Rossendale Borough Council</u>, <u>South Ribble Borough Council</u>, <u>West Lancashire Borough Council</u> and <u>Wyre Borough Council</u>.
