
Weekly update for coronavirus figures in the county

How is coronavirus affecting people in Lancashire?






For rate of cases detected via Pillar 1 & 2 testing: Lancashire 14 in the main remains in the highest and most severe range category.

Pillar 1 = swab testing in PHE labs & NHS hospitals for those with a medical need and key workers & their familiesPillar 2 = testing by commercial partners - swab testing for the wider population from out in the community

Positive tests are counted according to the date the sample was taken. However, most swabs taken in recent days will not yet have produced a result, so it is important not to jump to the conclusion that the epidemic is tailing off quicker than it really is. The PHE website cautions that only data from five days or more ago can be considered complete. The greyed-out columns in figure above are liable to be added to as more results come in.


The hospital admission figures are of people who had a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the 14 days prior to admission.

The weekly inpatient diagnoses are patients who received a confirmed COVID diagnosis after being admitted to hospital.






Weekly deaths occurring up to 8 January, compared with the five-year weekly average

Blackburn with Darwen and Blackpool's Covid-19 mortality rate is worse than the England rate.


Across the Lancashire-12 districts, Preston, West Lancashire and the East Lancashire districts the Covid-19 mortality rate is worse than the England rate and in Lancaster and Ribble Valley, it is below the England rate.
