Guidelines for use

This pack of signs is likely to be updated. When printing new signs always check back for the most recent versions.

Asymptomatic test sites need to have signs that inform and instruct the public.

Most of the signs required have been put together in a PowerPoint presentation. The text in the PowerPoint can be edited if needed. Each sign is on a separate page.

Sizing and placement

The signs can be printed in landscape on A4 or A3 paper.

Some signs will only be suitable for a larger print format. It is important that attention is paid to sign placement with consideration of the text size within signs. Check that people will be able to read the content from a reasonable distance. It is important that people do not feel they need to huddle around a sign or infographic in order to read it.

One sign, an infographic has also been included as an Adobe illustrator Vector file(ai). This infographic can be printed in sizes A4, A3 and upwards.

The signs should be put up in the relevant area of the test site (outside and inside).

Guidelines for use

Types of signs

Instructional - e.g. signs reminding the public to wear face coverings and follow social distancing rules.

Polite notices - e.g. signs welcoming the public.

journey (showing the 4 main steps involved in getting tested). There is an AI version of this that can be used to make a large poster. There is also a PowerPoint version of this infographic.

4 Infographics - each showing what stage of the testing journey a member of the public is at.

1 Infographic - showing the test swabbing instructions.

Recommendations

- Other signs that are suitable for a site's unique needs can be created and put up.
- The waiting time on any given day at a test site may be updated and put up outside and inside the site on a board or as a sign. It may also be announced.

• A local authority logo can be added to the sign on page 9 of this PowerPoint.

Translations

LAs will want to consider whether signs are required in alternative languages to support their local community.
