

**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 65(1) AND 66(4)
PROPOSED SHARED USE CYCLE WAY AND
SEGREGATED FOOTWAY/CYCLEWAY**



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 65(1) and 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 Lancashire County Council propose the following:

- 1) to convert the following lengths of footway to joint use cycleways:-
 - a) Clifton Road North, Lytham-St-Annes, the west side, from a point 17 metres north of its junction with the Centreline of Highbury Road West for a distance of 38.5 metres in a northerly direction;
 - b) Clifton Road North, Lytham-St-Annes, the west side, from a point 1.5 metres south of its junction with the Centreline of New Road, in a northerly direction to its junction with Squires Gate.
- 2) to convert the footway into segregated footway/cycleway, in Clifton Drive North, Lytham-St-Annes, the west side, from a point 55.5 metres north of its junction with the Centreline of Highbury Road West, in a northerly direction to a point 1.5 metres south of its junction with the Centreline of New Road.

A segregated cycleway(2-way) on the west side of Clifton Drive North, St Anne's is proposed to improve and encourage sustainable transport in and between local residential, employment and tourism areas. The cycleway will be located adjacent to a segregated footway, both facilitated by widening of the existing footway into the carriageway. To enable the safe transition of cycles between the segregated cycleway and highway, a length of shared use footway and cycleway will be required at the northern and southern ends of the proposed works. The cycleway will provide a safer route between and through St Anne's and Blackpool, integrating with and extending the off-highway section of National Cycle Route 62, north to Fleetwood, thereby preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
