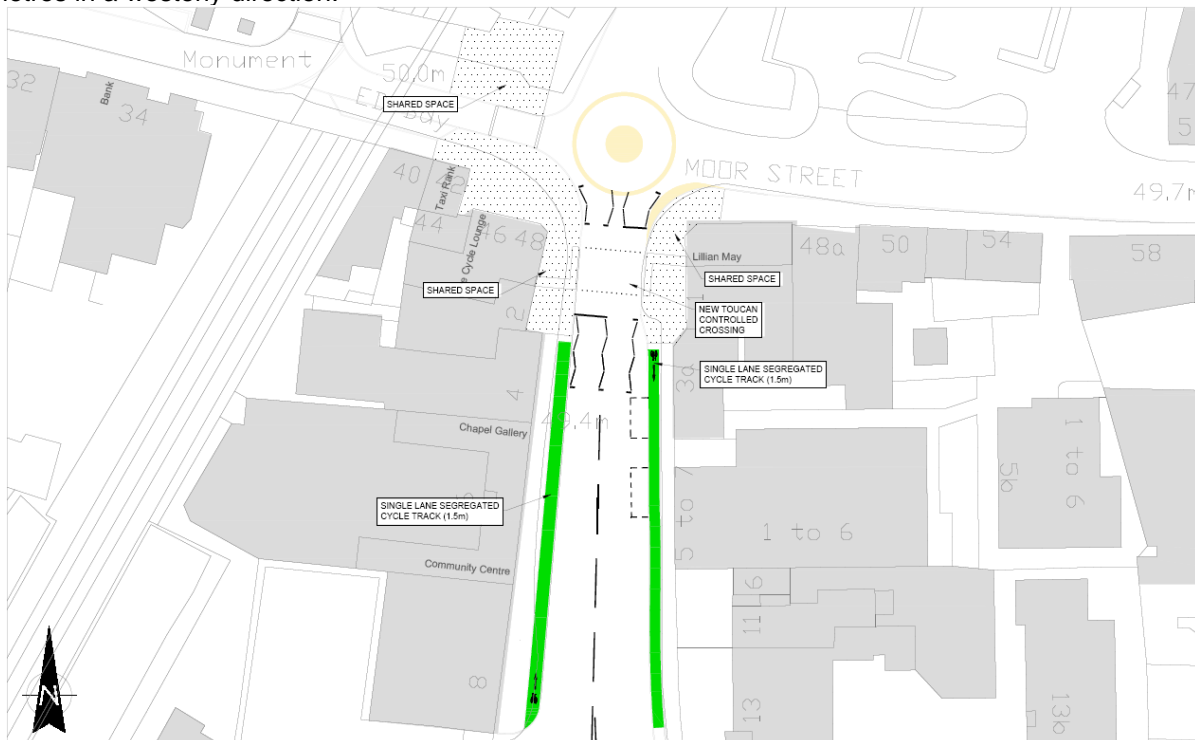




NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 65(1) and 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 Lancashire County Council propose to convert the following:

- 1) To convert the following lengths of footway into segregated footway/cycleway:
 - a) St Helens Road, Ormskirk, the west side, from a point 24 metres south of its junction with the Centreline of Moor Street for a distance of 48 metres in a southerly direction;
 - b) St Helens Road, Ormskirk, the east side, from a point 24 metres south of its junction with the Centreline of Moor Street for a distance of 48 metres in a southerly direction.
- 2) To convert the following lengths of footway into joint use cycleways:
 - a) St Helens Road, Ormskirk, the west side, From its junction with the Centreline of Moor Street for a distance of 24 metres in a southerly direction;
 - b) St Helens Road, Ormskirk, the east side, From its junction with the Centreline of Moor Street for a distance of 24 metres in a southerly direction;
 - c) Moor Street, Ormskirk, the north side, From its junction with the Centreline of St. Helens Road for a distance of 21 metres in a westerly direction;
 - d) Moor Street, Ormskirk, the south side, From its junction with the Centreline of St. Helens Road for a distance of 11 metres in an easterly direction;
 - e) Moor Street, Ormskirk, the south side, From its junction with the Centreline of St. Helens Road for a distance of 21 metres in a westerly direction.



Statement of Reasons

Following the ethos for the OEG project to improve travel connectivity to the nearby Edge Hill University, town centre, bus and railway stations for the non-motorised user, segregated cycle lanes are proposed along St Helens Road. Separate independent cycle lanes through the bus station along St Helens Road leading to Ruff Lane will provide a comfortable and safer place to cycle. It is hoped this will give confidence to encourage more users to consider commuting via non-motorised means for either the whole of or part of their intended journey, this will improve health and air quality for the residents of Ormskirk.
