Look at pictures in books or at photographs:

What can you see in the picture? How does it make you feel? What colours or patterns can you see? What is happening in the picture? Where did the picture come from ...? What can you see?

What do you think? Can you see any people/animals/objects in the picture? What are they doing? What are they wearing? Are their clothes the same as yours?

Which is your favourite picture? Why do you like it?
