





# The Simple Future Tense

# Use the simple future tense to talk about actions that will happen in the future.





If you want to form an affirmative sentence in the simple future tense, use this formula:

SUBJECT + "WILL" + BASE FORM OF VERB + REST OF SENTENCE

I will

feed

my cat.



If you want to build a negative sentence in the simple future tense, use the formula below:

SUBJECT + "WILL" + "NOT" + BASE FORM OF VERB + REST OF SENTENCE

She

will

not

go

to school tomorrow.





If you want to ask a question in the simple future tense, apply this formula:

"WILL" + SUBJECT + BASE FORM OF VERB + REST OF SENTENCE

Will

they

buy

a new house?





# Contractions

Contraction - two words that are joined with an apostrophe (') to form one word.



#### Contractions in affirmative sentences:

```
I will = I'll
you will = you'll
she will = she'll
he will = he'll
it will = it'll

we will = we'll
you will = you'll
they will = they'll
```

### Contractions in negative sentences:

```
I will not = I won't
you will not = you won't
she will not = she won't
he will not = he won't
it will not = it won't

we will not = we won't
you will not = you won't
they will not = they won't
```

In negative sentences you can contract words in two ways:

You won't meet Tom.

or

You'll not meet Tom.

#### The simple future is used to:

- predict what you think will happen
- describe decisions you have just made
  - make offers
  - make promises

```
Y, O, U,
W, I, L, L,
B, E,
O, K,
```

# PREDICTIONS

It will be a nice day tomorrow.



# QUICK DECISIONS

We will pay for the dessert.



# **OFFERS**

You look tired. Charles will make you a cup of coffee.



#### PROMISES

She will return the books by the end of the week.

Don't worry!



I think it will rain tomorrow.

Will she prepare the presentation by tomorrow morning?

Dad will dig in the garden next week.

Sue will not stay here tonight.

Will you play badminton with me in two hours?

We will go to Scotland in August.

They will not organise a party this afternoon.

I will repair the dripping tap soon.
