
J.K. Rowling

A little bit about her personal life



J. K. Rowling is a top-selling British author who wrote the world-famous story of Harry Potter. Joanne was born on the 31st July 1965 in Yate, which is a small town in the south-west of England. She has a younger sister named Dianne. When she was growing up, she loved reading lots of thought-provoking books and she also listened to rock music. She studied French and Latin at Exeter University and lived in Paris for a year. She was divorced once but she remarried and now she has three children.

A little bit more about her professional life



Joanne Rowling wanted to be a writer from a very young age and she really started writing early! When she was only six years old, she wrote a story called Rabbit. At the age of eleven she wrote her first novel about seven cursed diamonds.

One day she was travelling on a delayed train to London. On that journey the idea for the magical and captivating story of Harry Potter popped into her head. It happened in 1990 and it took her 5 years to finish the first book in the series called *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone*. Altogether there are seven thrilling books in this best-selling and record-breaking series and they became a huge global success. They have been published in 80 different languages and more than 500 million copies have been sold all over the world! You might know that they have also been made into 8 chart-topping movies.



Now about some of her other activities

J.K. Rowling is a philanthropist. A philanthropist is a person who cares a lot about other people and helps them in different ways. Joanne has made a great deal of money by writing her books and has become extremely rich. In fact, she is the first person to become a billionaire from writing books. However, she has decided to make good use of some of her wealth and help others. That is why she has founded an international charity called Lumos, which supports lots of disadvantaged children. She also fights against poverty and social inequality and has donated millions and millions of pounds to various charities.

And finally, some interesting facts

Did you know that...?

- 📖 The first Harry Potter book was rejected 12 times before it was published in June 1997.
- 📖 J.K. Rowling is the second richest female entertainer in the world.
- 📖 She wrote her first adult book *Casual Vacancy* in 2012.
- 📖 She even has a play called *Harry Potter and the Cursed Child*, which is sometimes called the eighth instalment of Harry Potter books.
- 📖 She has been awarded many different awards such as the Blue Peter Gold Badge and the Lifetime Achievement award.
- 📖 She donated around £15.3 million to a care and research facility.
