Describing People

Activities:

Use the PowerPoint presentation to practise speaking the words. Model the correct pronunciation of each word for the child/children to copy. Talk about the photographs and ask questions after each slide to promote discussion. Relate each 'topic' word to the child/children you are teaching. E.g. Where are your eyes? Do you wear glasses? Show me your hair. What colour is your hair?

Use the flashcards during this discussion. Ask children to find the related cards for each slide.

Using the matching cards, play memory games or Snap.

Ask children to draw pictures to show further understanding. Label the pictures using the flashcards.

Use the table below to generate oral sentences. Describe the people in the PowerPoint. Practise these sentences before writing to ensure correct use of grammar and vocabulary.

Write the sentences. These could be used to create a book or a poster.

Have fun with the children's new understanding. Show 'WANTED' posters for criminal characters. Ask the children to apply their understanding to describe each criminal.

Possible books to use:

'Burglar Bill' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg

'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak (Max is a naughty boy who gets sent to his room)

'Me and You' by Anthony Browne (A modern take on Goldilocks and the Three Bears)
