### Early education/work


However, Jane got over the fact: until, she noticed that after she finished school, she would not be able to pay for university. Instead she began to sort documents.

girl living in the jungle with wild animals. Jane and vanne had arrived at the shores of Gombe Stream.




Jane Goodhall with a chimp








in the picture.




Next, an arch would have formed by now, since the water has now washed the rocks into the ocean, leaving a clear arch. Some people even enjoy to walk underneath and

His appearance was different to the rest of the Gods, he had a puffed, black beard, he wore a metal helmet which made him invisible and a robe that he wore most of the time.


He looked quite evil, matching his personality. Hades was a sly, evil beast. He did what he wanted as not many other Gods could go to the underworld.
