Assessment in PSHE Education

PSHE Education is a subject like no other. The aim is to prepare children and young people for the world around them. Their worlds are all unique and individual to them- so how can we possibly assess what we have taught and the impact it has had?

This course aims to support leaders in addressing these concerns and providing practical solutions to be able to monitor the impact of teaching and learning in schools.

As a practical course, it aims to model and open discussions to support what assessment can look like and ways of gathering the evidence for different subjects.

How to teach effective reflection to allow learners to evaluate their own learning and how they can use it practically to support them in their daily lives.

Assessment in PSHE Education

This course will cover:

- What are we assessing when we assess PSHE Education?
- How do we gather assessment evidence? (Exploring a range of assessment strategies)
- What is the assessment telling us? (interpreting assessments to inform future planning and teaching)
- How can we evidence assessment? (de-bunking the myth about recording pupil progress)
- What next? (considering how to implement this in the classroom).

What to say and how to say it:



PSHE Education can sometimes be tricky to teach. It can sometimes lead to more questions than answers:
What does this...?
How does this...?
What if I...?
What if they...?
Can I...?
Where can I...?
Who can I ask/ tell about...?

This can be daunting for some staff. Sometimes, just knowing exactly what to say, how to approach difficult questions and knowing 'what the right thing to say' is can really build teaching confidence in PSHE education. This course de-bunks myths, explains exactly what to say when addressing those more 'uncomfortable' questions and allows delegates to walk away equipped with exactly what to say and how to say it.

Focusing on puberty and changes in adolescent bodies; mental health and wellbeing and safe and respectful relationships- this course creates a safe environment to support colleagues in feeling confident to teach these areas and not 'say the wrong thing'.

This course breaks down the barriers and shares Department for Education guidance.

SMALL numbers on the courses to allow for colleagues to feel comfortable for discussions.

Aimed at those new to teaching, new to a year group, new to leadership and those who just want to make sure they 'say the right thing'.

(there is a course for secondary and primary colleagues).

How to Effectively Plan Bespoke Lessons for the PSHE Education Curriculum

This course will cover:

- the roles and responsibilities of creating bespoke lessons;
- creating a lesson proforma and template to suit your school needs;
- developing lessons that are bespoke for your learners;
- how to use data to inform planning; and
- finding ways to evidence quality learning in lessons (including adaptive teaching for SEND pupils).

This course allows teachers and subject leads to delve into the primary statutory curriculum and begin to look at how to create adaptive lessons which meet the needs of learners within their schools. The course will look at curriculum planning and mapping; creating a formula to support teaching and learning of PSHE education and how data and assessments can be used to develop lessons which are bespoke to the needs of the children in school. In preparation for the review of the statutory guidance - it will support teachers to confidently address the question of 'why this, why now?' when they are planning and delivering PSHE education lessons to pupils.
