# BOROUGH OF PRESTON (HILL STREET AND FRIARGATE) (PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES) ORDER 1999

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Preston Borough Council pursuant to an arrangement entered into under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Lancashire County Council has made the above-named Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 92, 124(1)(c)(d) and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order was made on 16 September 1999 and comes into effect on 30 September 1999.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit vehicles, excluding cycles, from entering/egressing Hill Street at its junction with Friargate. This prohibition will enable a bus shelter to be sited in the vicinity of the closure as a part of the proposed Preston-Ingol-Tanterton Quality Bus Route. The closure will also address the poor accident record at the junction.

The closure is as follows:-

## Prohibition of Vehicles from the Hill Street/Friargate Junction

From the westerly kerb line of Friargate, at its junction with Hill Street, for a distance of 4 metres in a south westerly direction.

A copy of the Order, a statement of reasons and a map indicating the effect of the Order may be inspected at the office of the Town Clerk/Chief Executive, Town Hall, Lancaster Road, Preston during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that a requirement of the Act or any regulations thereunder have not been complied with may within six weeks from the date on which the order was made make application for the purpose to the High Court.

## BOROUGH OF PRESTON (HILL STREET AND FRIARGATE) (PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES) ORDER 1999

#### **WHEREAS**

- (1) The Preston Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Lancashire County Council may exercise certain of the powers possessed by the said County Council as the Highway Authority for the Borough of Preston.
- (2) The Council is satisfied that vehicular traffic in the road specified in the Order shall be prohibited in the manner set out in the Order in the interests of road safety and of improving the amenities of the area through which the road affected runs with particular reference to the facilities for public service vehicles.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1, 2, 4, 92, 124(1)(c)(d) and Part III and IV of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for Lancashire hereby makes the following Order.

## **Commencement and Citation**

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 30 day of September 1999 and may be cited as the "Borough of Preston (Hill Street and Friargate) (Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 1999".

#### Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order:-

"the Act of 1984" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"the Council" means the Council of the Borough of Preston;

"vehicle" means a goods vehicle, a motor cycle, an invalid carriage, a motor vehicle, or any other vehicle of any description whether drawn or propelled along a road by animal power but which excludes a bicycle, a tricycle or a cycle having four or more wheels.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- (3) The conditions, provisions, prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other such matter imposed by any Order or regulation made, or having effect as if made, under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.

3. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

# THE SCHEDULE

## Prohibition of Vehicles

On the length of Friargate, at its junction with Hill Street, which extends from the westerly kerb line of Friargate for a distance of 4 metres in a south westerly direction.
