


**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 65(1) and 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 Lancashire County Council propose to:

1. Introduce a segregated cycle track in Butler Street, Preston, from the Preston Station Cycle Hub, southbound on the west side of Butler Street for a distance of 135 metres to the station car park.

. Widen and convert the footway to shared use cycle way in the footpath linking Butler Street and East Cliff, Preston, for a distance of 77 metres in a generally south easterly direction from Butler St to Avenham Park, through the train station car

park.

## **Statement of Reasons**

Following the ethos for the TCF project to improve and encourage travel connectivity by sustainable transport modes, lengths of segregated cycle track and shared use cycleway from Preston Station Cycle Hub to Avenham Park will provide a comfortable and safer place to cycle. It's hoped this will give confidence to encourage more users to consider commuting and leisure travel via improved and better integrated sustainable and public transport means for either the whole of or part of their intended journey, improving health and air quality for the residents of Preston.
