


BEACON FELL COUNTRY PARK



- A Spade Meadow** – Snipe, curlew and lapwings nest here in the spring. In the summer these fields are full of wildflowers and butterflies. The meadow is also great for sledging in the winter. Please use the gates and stiles provided and be aware of livestock in the fields.
- B Rosemary's Wood** – Life For A Life is a charity that offers you the chance to celebrate or commemorate your loved ones by planting memorial trees in Rosemary's Wood. For further information visit www.lifeforlife.org.uk or tel: 0161 624 2299.
- C Starling Wood** – Named because large numbers of starlings would roost there in the evenings.
- D Dew Pond** – This pond has no streams flowing into it and is formed simply from ground and rain water.
- E Queens Grove** – 40 oaks were planted in November 1992 to celebrate forty years since the accession of Queen Elizabeth II to the throne. These trees were grown from seeds from the tallest sessile oak *Quercus Patraea* in Great Britain.
- F Larch Avenue** – The original road to Fell House Farm where the visitor centre now stands is lined by larch trees.
- G Shield Wood** – Planted in 1938 to commemorate the coronation of King George VI, a belt of sycamore and mountain ash outline the shield shape.
- H Black Tiger Wood** – The woods grown up around the Black Tiger Pit are a mixture of self seeded trees grown up after the fire in 2002. The Black Tiger still lurks here...
- I The Tarn** – A Biological Heritage Site for 11 species of dragonflies and damselflies. The adults may only live for 2 to 8 weeks but they live as nymphs (larvae) in the pond for up to 6 years.
- J Carwags Barbecue Area** – This site is the only place on the park where stoves and barbecues are allowed. You can either use the barbecue grates provided or use your own stoves. Toilets are available at this car park.

Sculpture Trail

Sculptures made from local materials form a trail starting at the Orme Sight and passes the refurbished Heron and Walking Snake, the Bat, Living Willow Deer and Black tiger.
