



Local Themes - Contextual Safeguarding

Contextual Safeguarding is an approach to understanding and responding to young people's experiences of significant harm beyond their families. These threats might arise at a variety of places including community spaces and online. It is one of the key priorities for the Children's Safeguarding Assurance Partnership.

In Lancashire there is a commitment to reduce the exploitation of children and young people. All agencies need to work together in a coordinated and consistent way to support children and families building on their strengths and finding joint solutions to improve outcomes.

In Lancashire we are currently focusing on:

- Child Sexual Exploitation
- Child Criminal Exploitation
- Child Trafficking/Modern Slavery

Priority 3: Increase our success in respect of detection, disruption and prosecution while working to support those we know to be exploited

Priority 4: Work alongside and within our communities to tackle exploitation
