5. The fifth step is to implement the plan and monitor the results.

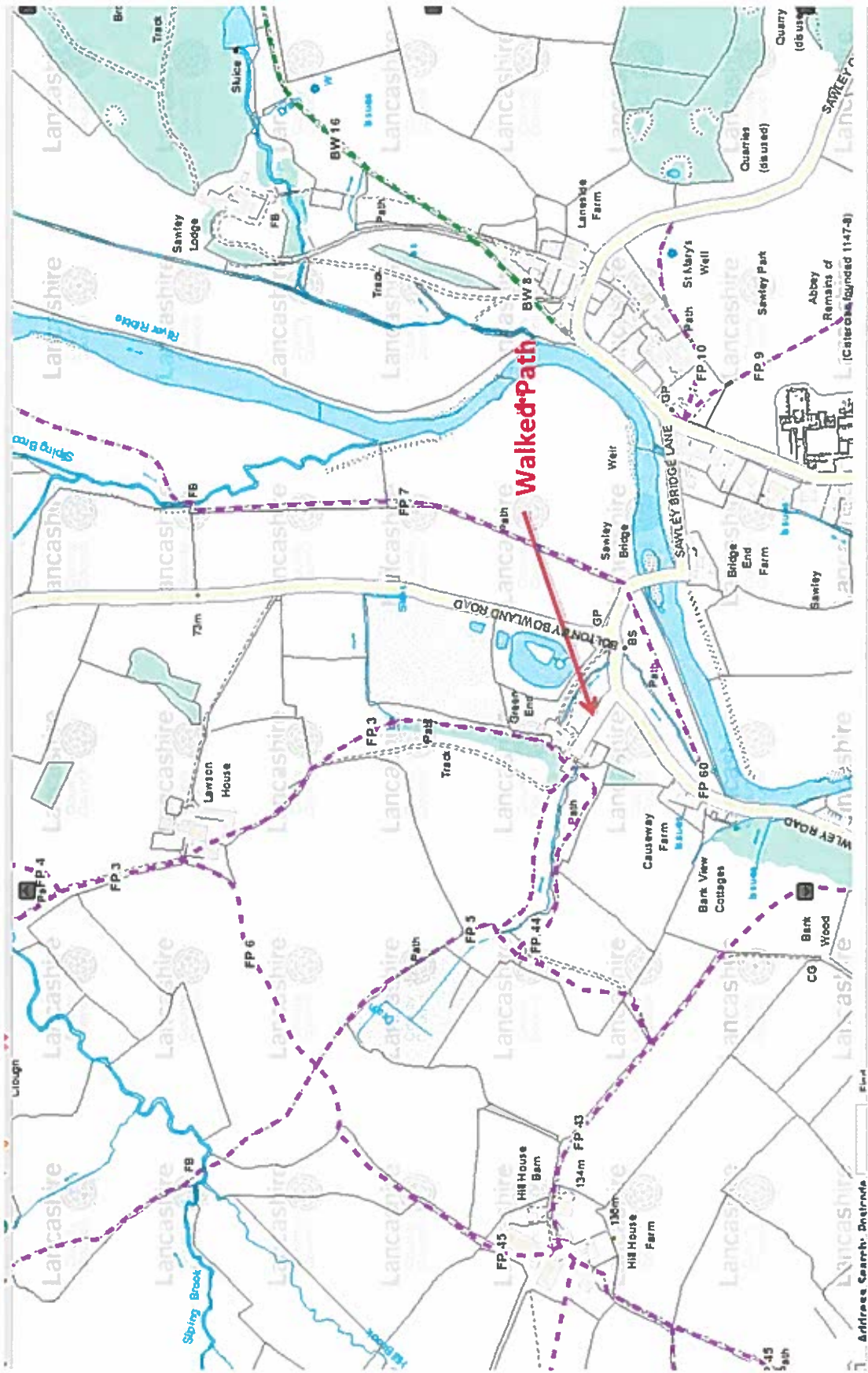
6. The sixth step is to evaluate the results and make adjustments as needed.
