Purpose To carry out a limited number of tasks in support of, or the delivery of, the service.
Scope of Work Role holders will undertake a limited number of routine procedures and use associated basic tools and equipment. Minimal personal initiative is required.
Accountabilities/Responsibilities The following are a range of duties that are appropriate to this grade. The Operational Context Form will specify duties appropriate for the role. ▪ Observes personal duty of care in relation to service users, equipment or other resources used in the course of work. ▪ Duties are clearly defined and leave little room for discretion. ▪ Role holders are either directly supervised or controlled by the prescriptive nature of the work.
Skills, knowledge and experience ▪ Little, or no, prior experience is required. Role holders will need to gain an understanding of a limited number of routine procedures that could be gained through a short induction period or on the job training or instruction. ▪ Ability to work as a member of a team.
Performance Indicators ▪ Carry out all tasks as instructed to required standards.
