

Street Pastors

PSHE enrichment for secondary school students?

Street Pastors are volunteers from local church communities who care, listen and help those we meet in our towns and cities. Started over 20 years ago in Brixton, there are now over 12,000 Street Pastors in over 200 areas in the UK.

Mostly out until the early hours we assist those we come across who are in need, many who are young and often vulnerable. Lost, separated from friends, had too much to drink, or worst of all a flat mobile battery!

Aiming to keep people safe, we are happy to talk to secondary school pupils, share what we do, and offer advice for keeping safe when they do venture out to the night clubs and venues when old enough. Through an interactive session we share what we carry in our rucksacks, do some group work on real life scenarios, and have some fun whilst conveying a serious safety message.

We also touch on our Christian motivation in doing this work and how our faith is shown in action on the streets. We can tailor sessions as required and there is no cost involved. Interested over 18's are welcome to come along one night for some first hand experience

New LPDS (Teaching & Learning Website)

You should be aware by now that the Lancashire Grid for Learning (LancsNGFL) has moved & is combined with the Lancashire Professional Development Service website. This new LPDS Teaching and Learning Website can be accessed here: <u>www.lancashire.gov.uk/lpds</u> your RE website subscription is located here <u>Religious Education - LPDS Resources</u> (lancashire.gov.uk)

In order to have your own account set up on the new website the head needs to follow the guidance sent to them in July via the portal, included here



Once this is done you should visit <u>www.lancashire.gov.uk/lpds</u> and select 'login', then select 'forgot password? Please use the email address that your head registered to your account. Please note that you can not do this if the head has not already set up an account for you, only the head can do this, see the letter below that was sent to the head with instructions.



This means that you no longer need to use the generic password but can instead create your own.
