Using the Early Talk Boost Intervention to Boost Children's Language Skills What is Early Talk Boost? Early Talk Boost is a targeted intervention aimed at 3-4 year old children with delayed language helping to boost their language skills to narrow the gap between them and their peers. The programme aims to accelerate children's progress in language and communication by an average of 6 months, after a nine week intervention. The early years pupil premium (EYPP) provides opportunities for settings to enable children to move closer to fulfilling their potential. Early Talk Boost is one way of allowing settings to evidence the impact of their EYPP spend. Each Early Talk Boost intervention pack includes: Participant Book, Intervention Manual, Parent Workshop materials, Tracker Tool, Toolkit of toys, puppets and musical instruments, 10 x 8 Jake and Tizzy story books. Tots Talking - a parent intervention for 2 year olds at risk of language difficulties What is Tots Talking? The Tots Talking programme was designed and developed by Speech and Language UK with a group of parents of 2-year-old children. The aim of Tots Talking is to improve the talking and understanding of words in two-year-olds. It does this by sharing information with parents and carers and encouraging them to use the types of language and behaviours which research shows support children's talking and understanding of words. Tots Talking is aimed at parents and caregivers of 2-year-old children who are not using contingent language with them. Included in the training pack is: a facilitator guide to help run the sessions, access to the Tots Talking App, child engagement measure.
