ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (ALBERT STREET, EARBY, PENDLE BOROUGH) (REVOCATION AND PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 202*

The County Council of Lancashire ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 92 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order: -

1. <u>Definitions and Interpretation</u>

For all the purposes of this Order the terms described in this Article shall have the meanings specified:

"Vehicle" means a motor vehicle, a passenger vehicle, a dual-purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle, a motorcycle or an invalid carriage or any other vehicle of any description whether drawn or propelled along a road by animal or mechanical power.

2. Revocation

Those parts of "The Borough of Pendle (Victoria Road to Albert Street, Earby) (One-Way) Order, 1994", as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order, are hereby revoked.

3. Prohibition of Driving

Save as is hereinafter provided, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle, to proceed along the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 2 to this Order.

This prohibition includes an obstruction in accordance with Section 92 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

4. Exemptions

Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to travel along any part of the lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:

- a) the Vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- b) the Vehicle to be used for the purposes of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road;
- c) if the Vehicle is being used in connection with the carrying out, or on premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road, of any of the following operations namely;
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads;
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus or the exercise of any other statutory power or

duty for the maintenance and supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in Section 4 of the Telecommunications Act 1984.

5. <u>Miscellaneous</u>

The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made, or having effect as if made, under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

6. Commencement of Order

This Order shall come into force on the ****** 202* and may be cited as the "Lancashire County Council (Albert Street, Earby, Pendle Borough) (Revocation And Prohibition Of Driving) Order 202*".

Schedule 1 - Revocations

The one way restriction on Unnamed Side Street leading from Victoria Road to Albert Street, Earby, between its junction with Victoria Road and a point 20 metres to the south-east in a south-easterly direction.

<u>Schedule 2 – Prohibition of Driving</u>
Albert Street, Earby, from its junction with Victoria Road for a distance of 20 metres in a south easterly direction.
