Road safety

It is very important to teach road safety to our children from a very young age so that they are aware of:

- Traffic recognition
- Understand the difference between the footpath and the road

- Be bright be seen
- Getting lost and safe places to play
- Make children aware of electric cars that are very quiet, so stopping and looking properly
