People at the Heart of Care white paper – December 2021

Main goals of the paper

- Promoting Independence: Empowering individuals to live independently for as long as possible, with personalized care and support.
- Preventing Crisis: Focusing on early intervention and prevention to avoid crises and hospital admissions.
- Improving Quality of Care: Enhancing the quality of care provided by care workers and ensuring their well-being.
- Supporting the Workforce: Investing in training, development, and fair pay for care workers.
- **Strengthening Partnerships**: Collaborating with local authorities, the NHS, and other stakeholders to create a seamless care system.
- **Ensuring Sustainability**: Developing a sustainable funding model for adult social care.

Who are we and what have we achieved so far

- Formed in October 2021 in anticipation of the white paper being published
- Delivered over £1 million pounds in grants across the ICB footprint during
 2022 and 2023
- Assisted over 200 care providers so far
- Impacted over 800 individuals so far
- Delivered projects around digital social care records, falls prevention, digitised medicine dispensing and eMARS
- Finalist in the Health Services Journal Digital team of the Year 23
- Co-created the NHS-E Blueprint for the DSCR programme

Funding

What the project can fund

- Funding towards one year license costs
- Implementation costs up to £500 inc VAT
- Training costs up to £1500 inc VAT

Providers must

- Be CQC registered
- Currently record care plans on paper OR have gone live with one of our Assured Suppliers within the last 6 months
- Once live complete a short case study and let us know about printing cost savings

What the project currently cannot fund

- Devices
- Integration of Apps or additional systems
- Suppliers Bolt-ons
- Wifi upgrade & boosters
