Initial thoughts



- Schools had been approaching secondary advisers and consultants asking about links to other schools (in relation to subjects and themes)
- Links suggested were then sometimes restricted to SISG schools
- Looking to build on the SLE model and network
- A professional development opportunity for staff
- A chance to connect schools together who may not usually link
- Opportunity to offer links in areas where there is not secondary LA or consultant support

What have we been mindful of?

- The changing landscape in Lancashire (Trusts/LA etc)
- Time out of school and staff commitments
- That the LA role is to facilitate the linking and then schools develop further



What are our thoughts?

- Headteachers could "nominate" subject teachers/curriculum or senior leaders with a real strength/expertise in a certain area (more details on the next slide)
- These staff are then registered on a Directory held by Secondary Advisory team admin support
- If a school approaches the advisory/consultant/LA team we can link the schools together
- The LA would not have further involvement after that connection has been made



Why this structure?



- The LA would not co-ordinate the support- this would be up to schools to arrange/liaise (including any costs to be charged)
- We are not quality assuring the programme or the staff nominated; however we know that interested schools would research a possible link and Headteachers would nominate staff who exhibit great practice
- It is about linking and connecting and then schools following that up/developing it further



Professional development



- We want to offer some cost-free professional development for those nominated
- Build the group as a network
- Professional development for those involved
- We know the power of this in terms of retention
- Provisional CPD launch day in Preston on 3rd June 2024



Launch/CPD day



Sessions to cover:

- What could S2SS look like? Exploring what you may be able to offer to other schools
- The logistics: how/timings/requests/financial/admin/links etc
- Best practice guidance about that initial contact, building rapport and developing a positive relationship
- "A coaching approach": developing your coaching skills to support and challenge
- Building a picture": gaining a deeper understanding of the strengths and areas for development in the chosen subject/theme
- What to do if...? (Exploring some of the situations colleagues may face and how best to approach these challenges)
- Working together to plan for development: best practice in working with the school to plan for next steps/actions for improvement



How could this develop?



- Into more cross-curricular themes (e.g. those which emerged from the Inclusion Summits)
- Other CPD opportunities for staff involved
- A programme that staff are proud to say they have been part of
- Retention to posts in school as a result of a further CPD opportunity
- Could support the Appraisal process for all involved
- Links in other areas being forged and developed
