TROUGH ROAD, DUNSOP BRIDGE, RIBBLE VALLEY (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2024

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council has made an Order under **Section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the roads set out in this notice.

- 1. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed over that length of Trough Road, Dunsop Bridge from outside Smelt Mill Cottage for approximately 50 metres in both directions.
- 2. Nothing in this order shall apply to persons engaged in the carrying out of the works.
- 3. The prohibition will be operative from 0800 hours on Wednesday 24th April 2024 until 1630 hours on Friday 3rd May 2024 or until completion of the works within this period.
- 4. Vehicular access for residents will be maintained whenever and wherever possible. Pedestrian access to properties will always be maintained.
- 5. An alternative route for vehicular traffic affected by the closure is via:— Marshaw Wyre, Abbeystead – Scorton Marshaw Road, Over Wyresdale – Long Lane, Scorton – Oakenclough Road, Scorton – Delph Lane, Bleasdale – Bleasdale Lane, Bleasdale – Oakenclough Road, Beacon – Lower Core Lane, Chipping – Startifants Lane, Chipping – Fish House Lane, Chipping – Church Raike, Chipping – Talbot Street, Chipping – Burtholm Lane, Chipping – Dinkling Green Lane, Chipping – Wardsley Road, Chipping – Dunsop Road, Whitwell – Dunsop Road, Dunsop Bridge and vice versa

The temporary prohibition is necessary to allow a new electrical connection works to be carried out.
