(ST MICHAELS ROAD, BILSBORROW, PINFOLD LANE, INSKIP WITH SOWERBY & HALL LANE, MYERSCOUGH, WYRE BOROUGH)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC) ORDER 2024

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council has made an Order under **Section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the roads set out in this Order.

- 1. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed over the following lengths of highway in the Borough of Wyre:
 - i. St Michaels Road, Bilsborrow from its junction with Hall Lane for approximately 390 metres in an easterly direction.
 - ii. Pinfold Lane, Inskip with Sowerby from its junction with Sowerby Road for approximately 770 metres in a westerly direction to Long Wood Bridge.
- iii. Hall Lane, Myerscough from its junction with Blackpool Road for its entire length to its junction with St Michaels Road, Bilsborrow.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall apply to persons engaged in the carrying out of the works.
- 3. The prohibitions will be operative <u>nightly</u> from 2100 hours to 0600 hours from Monday 1st July 2024 until Friday 12th July 2024 or until completion of the works within this period.
- 4. Vehicular access for residents will be maintained whenever and wherever possible. Pedestrian access to properties will always be maintained.
- 5. An alternative route for vehicular traffic affected by the closure is via:

St Michaels Road – Preston Lancaster New Road – Tarnacre Lane – A586 Garstang Road – Raikes Road – Copp Lane – Lodge Lane – Preston Road – Pinfold Lane

The temporary prohibition is necessary to allow cabling and de-silting works to be carried out by BT Openreach.
