PTL138 - Great Teaching Bitesize: Explicit Teaching of Learning Behaviours

Consider how to improve behaviour for learning through:

- teaching consistent, predictable routines; and
- explicit teaching of learning behaviours e.g., managing distractions, being an independent learner, being an effective learning partner etc. Many schools are facing increasing challenges regarding low level disruption and passive learning. This course will give a range of strategies to address this.
