If you love singing and are part of a choir, this competition returns for the fourth year in 2025.

Lancashire Choir of the Year aims to encourage a wide range of choirs from communities, workplaces and high schools to come together to showcase their love of singing.

Open to people from Lancashire, Blackpool and Blackburn with Darwen, the popular contest sees singing groups record their best performance on video, in a bid to reach the finals.

A panel of top singing professionals will judge the videos and select six finalist choirs who will go through to a live final in November.

On the pight, the panel will appounce the overall.

On the night, the panel will announce the overall winner, as well as runner up prizes and a 'People's Choice' award.

Choirs have until 28 July 2025 to enter.

Make Music Day, also known as Fête de la Musique, began in France in 1982 and was originally created to celebrate the summer solstice, with musicians entertaining communities in the streets.

The concept was later introduced to the United States by an American musician in 2006, and

has since evolved into a global event, with more than 120 countries worldwide now marking the day with music performances and music themed events. These events are held in public spaces, always free of charge and open to anyone who wants to get involved.

You don't have to be a trained musician to participate either. The day celebrates and promotes music in all its forms and musicians of all skill levels are encouraged to perform and give concerts for everyone to enjoy.




Synopsis:





News from St Leonard's Gilbert and Sullivan Group


St Leonard's Gilbert and Sullivan Group will be bringing another well-loved show in May to St Leonard's Church in Penwortham. *Ruddigore*, also known as The Witch's Curse, is a parody of the Victorian's love of gothic melodrama genre, filled with curses, ghosts, and a love story intertwined with humour and satire.

This convoluted tale takes place in the fishing village of Rederring and involves villagers, bridesmaids, sailors and the local gentry all vying for attention whilst being terrorised by the bad baronet of Ruddigore, whose family has been accursed for centuries. The tale reaches its conclusion via a chorus of ghosts and the return to life of the last bad baronet who died, who announces that he is now 'practically alive'! As always, the plot twist at the end that lifts the curse is a sign of the genius of Gilbert and Sullivan's music, which is as melodious, dramatic and enjoyable as ever.

The Group are currently busy rehearsing for the show in May 2024 and would love to see you there. The show runs from Thursday 22nd May to Saturday 24th May and tickets cost £10 with accompanied under 12's free.



Haffner Orchestra

What an evening of beautiful and moving music we have in store for you, one we very much hope you can make on this summer evening in Lancaster.

If you are not familiar with Ingrid Stölzel's music, it has been described as 'tender and beautiful' and creating a 'haunting feeling of lyrical reflection and suspension in time and memory'. Her inspiration for City Beautiful is a belief that the beautification of our physical surroundings promotes a sense of community. She very much feels that music has a similar power to influence and shape a community.

The Haffner Orchestra will then perform Samuel Barber's Violin Concerto with our soloist Sophie Rosa. Sophie is currently Leader of Sinfonia Viva and appears as guest leader with many orchestras across the UK. The story and history of Barber's Violin Concerto reads like a soap opera—literally. Its commission came from the laundry soap manufacturer, Samuel Fels, whose son, Iso Briselli, was an accomplished violinist. What happened next is still shrouded in mystery (was it 'unplayable', 'too modern' or 'too light weight') but it is now a piece of music that has become one the most frequently performed of all 20th Century concertos.

The evening will end with the New World Symphony by Dvorak. This familiar and comforting symphony was written by Dvorak during his time in America the 'new world', in the 1890s. It is a piece of music all about place, discovering something new and experiencing new things, inspired by the sights and sounds he experienced in America.

Please do be sure to join us for what will be a truly lovely way to spend a summer's evening.

What an evening of beautiful and moving music we have in store for you, one we very much hope you can make on this summer evening in Lancaster.


