NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce road humps in the following locations:

- a) Pear Tree Lane, Euxton, from a point 18 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Euxton Lane for a distance of 3 metres in a southerly direction;
- b) Pear Tree Lane, Euxton, from a point 93 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Euxton Lane for a distance of 3 metres in a southerly direction:
- c) Pear Tree Lane, Euxton, from a point 168 metres south of its junction with the centreline of Euxton Lane for a distance of 3 metres in a southerly direction;
- d) Pear Tree Lane Euxton, from a point 21 metres north of its junction with the centreline of School Lane for a distance of 3 metres in a northerly direction;
- e) School Lane, Euxton, from a point 39 metres west of its junction with the centreline of Pear Tree Lane for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction.

The road humps will have a maximum height not exceeding 75mm.

Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the proposed Speed Cushions on Pear Tree Lane and School Lane are to help further enforce the change of speed limit in the area to 20mph, slowing traffic and allowing the safe passage of pedestrians.

The proposals are being pursued as part of a s278 Agreement under the Highways Act 1980 as part of the housing development which will introduce further traffic movements along Pear Tree Lane and School Lane.
