NOTICE OF PROPOSAL HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (SCHOOL LANE, EUXTON, CHORLEY BOROUGH) (SPEED HUMPS (2))



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 90A of the **Highways Act 1980**, Lancashire County Council propose to introduce road humps in the following locations:

- a) School Lane, Euxton from a point 12 metres north east of its junction with the centreline of The Cherries for a distance of 3 metres in a north easterly direction;
- b) School Lane, Euxton from a point 66 metres south west of its junction with the centreline of The Cherries for a distance of 3 metres in a south westerly direction;
- c) School Lane, Euxton from a point 13 metres east of its junction with the centreline of Vicarage Close for a distance of 3 metres in an easterly direction;
- d) School Lane, Euxton from a point 33 metres west of its junction with the centreline of Vicarage Close for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction.

The road humps will have a maximum height not exceeding 75 mm.

Statement of Reasons

The purpose of the proposed Speed Cushions on Pear Tree Lane and School Lane are to help further enforce the change of speed limit in the area to 20mph, slowing traffic and allowing the safe passage of pedestrians.

The proposals are being pursued as part of a s278 Agreement under the Highways Act 1980 as part of the housing development which will introduce further traffic movements along Pear Tree Lane and School Lane.
