Use this template to help you identify some of the risks you may encounter while taking part in Brake's Kids Walk. Your children's safety is paramount at all times so please continue to follow your school's usual procedures for assessing risk and keeping children safe. Remember that as well as identifying any possible risks, you should also explain any measures you have put in place to mitigate those risks. It is important that you do your risk assessment 'walk about' at the same time as you plan to take part in Brake's Kids Walk, and on a school day. If your walk involves hundreds of children, you need to think about this when you are doing your assessment. For example, it takes a long time to walk hundreds of children over a pelican crossing!

Step 2 Walking safely

The adults will have been instructed before the event to ensure children walk calmly and hold hands throughout the walk, and stay on the pavement
