Something to do this week! Review your systems for accident reporting

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) states that "Providers must take all necessary steps to keep children safe and well2 (P15 for childminder, P22 for settings)

Accidents often happen and this cannot be controlled, however, we can carry out risk assessments and put procedures in place to minimise the risks. By following good practice and procedures such as keeping cups of tea out of reach of children, we can go some way to protect them.

If an accident does occur – what are the steps you need to follow?

Once any immediate danger or injuries are dealt with, you need to think about

- What needs to be recorded?
- What and Who does it need to be reported to?
- Would the accident result in an insurance claim?

The EYFS states that a record of accidents and/or injuries and first aid treatments must be kept. For certain accidents or incidents, you must inform Ofsted

A list of what they need to be informed of is found here –

You also need to inform your public liability provider of any serious injuries. Certain injuries and dangerous occurrences must also be reported to RIDDOR Make a RIDDOR report - Overview - HSE and this includes if a child has broken a bone.

This week we are shouting a fabulous Wednesday Well **Done** to FOUR more settings in Lancashire who have recently has their **Outstanding Ofsted inspection** reports published!

Penelope Cowley a childminder in Bacup is thrilled with her inspection outcome. Penelope said that the inspector put her and her assistant at ease from the start. She had displayed the children's work up on the wall that captured the attention of the inspector, and he could see that how she linked her learning to other topics. Her inspector noted how — 'Children develop extremely good behaviour and attitudes. The childminder is an excellent role model, who has high expectations of children's behaviour. Children listen very well and willingly help others.' Penelope's top tip is to be confident, know what you are good at and show the best of yourself.

- Kim Hudson a childminder in Burnley also had her practice and provision deemed outstanding, with the inspector noting how Kim's –' curriculum is highly ambitious and well sequenced. The childminder's teaching is superb. Meticulous ongoing assessments of children's progress and getting to know their interests means that bespoke, purposeful learning experiences are always provided.' Kim said the day went really well and the inspector was lovely. She asked plenty of questions relating to her practice including communication and language development and safeguarding. Kim's top tip is to showcase your skills of being a childminder.
- Marie Ford in Burnley is our third childminder who had an outstanding inspection judgement. Her inspector reported that- 'Children make excellent progress and are superbly prepared for their next stage of learning. The childminder has particularly high expectations of children's behaviour, and as a result, they behave beautifully. Children show the utmost respect for the childminder and for each other.' Marie said she is delighted to have been graded as outstanding once again. She said the inspector was really great and gave her feedback throughout the day. Marie's top tip is to be yourself and show how much you love your role by showing the best of what you do.
- Kids Planet Poulton Carr are very proud to have been awarded outstanding. Manager Georgina Simpson said that the day went really well and the flow of the day was very natural and the same as every other day. It was an opportunity to show all the things they do on a daily basis and their inspector captured how: 'Procedures for monitoring children's progress are robust. This means that emerging gaps in their learning and development are identified early, and gaps are swiftly closed. Skilful teaching throughout the nursery supports all children to make excellent progress.'
