

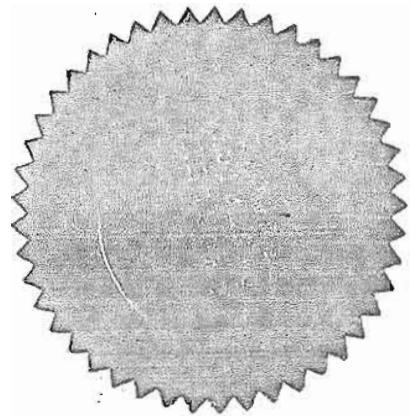

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967
THE CHORLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL
(BLACKBURN ROAD, WHITTLE-LE-WOODS AND CHORLEY)
(40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) ORDER, 1975

The Borough Council of Chorley (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 74(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:-

1. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. This Order may be cited as the Chorley Borough Council Blackburn Road, Whittle-le-Woods and Chorley (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order, 1975.
4. This Order shall take effect on the 15th May, 1975.

That length of Blackburn Road (B.6228) in the Parish of Whittle-le-Woods from its junction with the M.61 Wheelton link Road to a point opposite the Railway Inn, Botany, Chorley, a distance of approximately 1,578 metres.
