## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

(B6601 ROUNDABOUT AND LEAPERS WOOD ROAD, OVER KELLET, LANCASTER CITY) (REVOCATION AND PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIANS AND CYCLES) ORDER 2025

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on 20 June 2025 Lancashire County Council made the above Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

- 1. Revoke the "Lancashire County Council (B6601 Roundabout and Leapers Wood Road, Over Kellett, Lancaster City) (Prohibition of Pedestrians, Equestrians, Cycles and Horse Drawn Vehicles) Order 2022" in full.
- 2. Introduce a prohibition of pedestrians in the following lengths of road:
  - a) B6601 Roundabout, Over Kellet, from its junction with Leapers Wood (B6601) for its full circumference;
  - b) Leapers Wood Road (B6601), Over Kellet, all sides, from its junction with Kellet Road (B6254) for its entire length.
- 3. Introduce a prohibition of cycles in the following lengths of road:
  - a) B6601 Roundabout, Over Kellet, from its junction with Leapers Wood (B6601) for its full circumference;
  - b) Leapers Wood Road (B6601), Over Kellet, all sides, from its junction with Kellet Road (B6254) for its entire length.

This Order will come into force on the 07 July 2025. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
