**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that in accordance with Section 65(1) and 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 Lancashire County Council propose to convert the following lengths of footway to joint use cycleways:-

- 1) Crematorium Avenue, Preston, the north east side, from its junction with the centreline of Longridge Road for a distance of 15 metres in a south easterly direction;
- 2) Longridge Road, Preston, the south east side, from its junction with the centreline of Crematorium Avenue to its junction with the centreline of Roman Way;
- 3) Roman Way, Preston, the south west side, from its junction with the centreline of Longridge Road for a distance of 33 metres in a south easterly direction.



## **Statement of Reasons**

The proposals are being pursued as part of a Section 278 agreement under the Highways Act 1980. These proposals are being funded fully by the developer and are linked to the new commercial development and associated planning conditions. The purpose of the proposed off road shared cycle-way is to upgrade and improve sustainable transport links to the site and to support social inclusion and additional links to the guild wheel cycle route.
