(BROADFIELD DRIVE AND WOODLEA ROAD, LEYLAND, SOUTH RIBBLE BOROUGH) (REMOVAL AND INTRODUCTION OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

- 1) Remove a zebra crossing in Broadfield Drive, Leyland, from a point 2 metres south of its junction with the centreline of West Paddock for a distance of 42 metres in a northerly direction.
- 2) Introduce a puffin crossing in Woodlea Road, and extending into Broadfield Drive, Leyland, from a point 11 metres south of its junction with the centreline of West Paddock for a distance of 54.5 metres in a northerly direction.

Statement of Reasons

The proposals are being pursued as part of a Section 278 agreement under the Highways Act 1980 under the Town and Country Planning Act as part of a new development linked to 72 age restricted apartments including a cafe bistro and a small retail unit (open to the public) and the associated planning conditions. Which will introduce further traffic and pedestrian movements.

The purpose of the removal of the existing zebra crossing and replacement with the proposed Puffin crossings is to provide safe crossing point for pedestrians to promote sustainable travel and promote social inclusion. The proposal seeks to mitigate against the increase in traffic and pedestrian movements generated by the new housing development.
