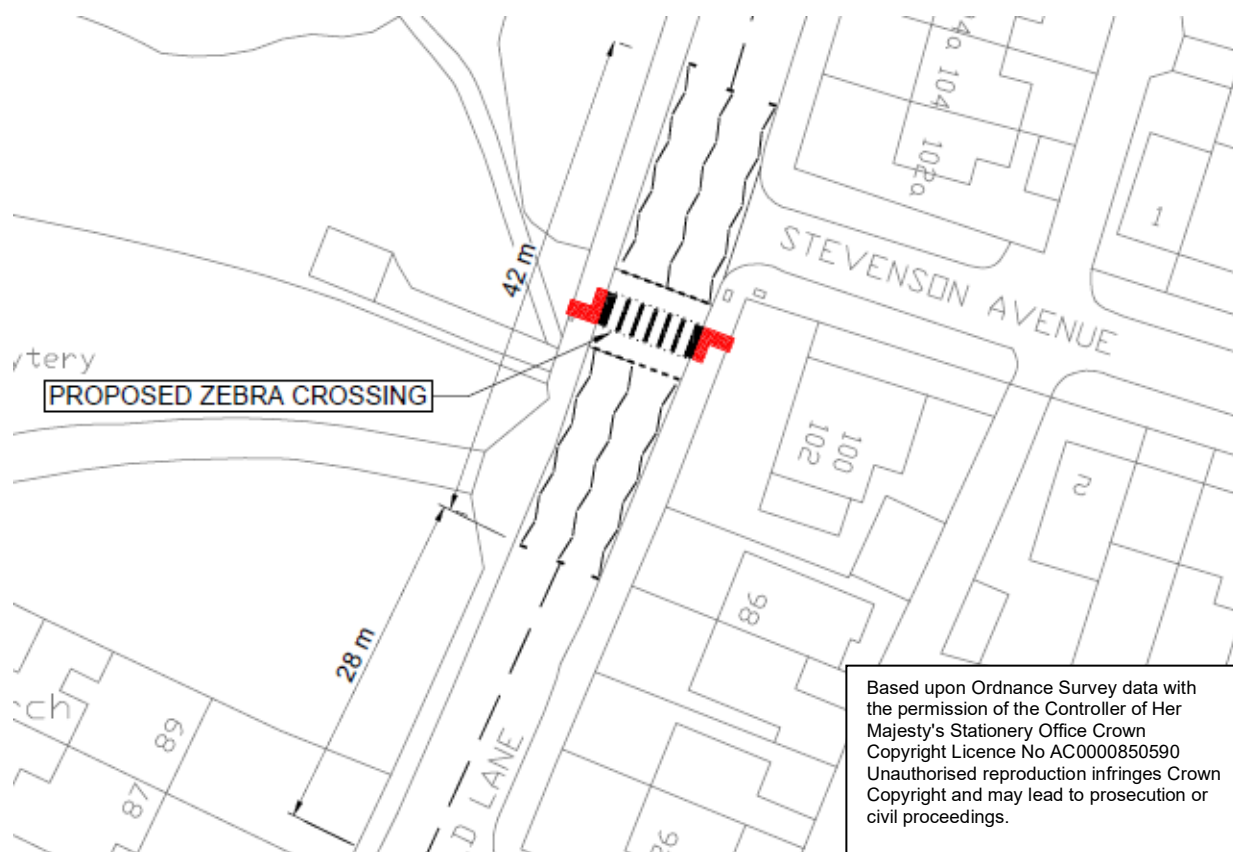


NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(STANIFIELD LANE, FARINGTON, SOUTH RIBBLE BOROUGH)
(INTRODUCTION OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSING)



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above pedestrian crossing under Section 23 of the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to introduce a Zebra Crossing on Stanifield Lane, Farington, from a point 28 metres north east of its junction with the centreline of Gloucester Avenue for a distance of 42 metres in a north easterly direction.



Statement of Reasons

For many years there has been strong local support to provide a safe crossing point for pedestrians on the busy Stanifield Lane in Farington. It is proposed to introduce a zebra crossing on Stanifield Lane, south west of its junction with Stevenson Avenue, linking the residential area to Farington Park and the local play area. The purpose of this proposal is to improve safety, support active travel and provide a convenient and accessible crossing point for pedestrians, cyclists and vulnerable users.
